plus revenue to a water trust fund. The speaker had little problem getting the 127-14 vote, although opponents tied him up in debate for three hours.

Under the proposal, which vo-ters will decide in the November election, half of all the state sur-plus would be deposited in a water trust fund and the remainder in a reserve fund. The Legislature by a two-thirds vote could appropriate the money in the reserve for spe-cial or needed programs.

The water trust fund would be used to meet future water problems, Clayton said. He said water would become more critical in the

state, especially since the popula-tion is expected to grow to 25 mil-lion in less than 30 years. This is an innovative tool that will help Texas in the future," Clayton said. "We will be able to solve water problems before they




