Shipment of laetrile is legal, judge rules

United Press International OKLAHOMA CITY — Laetrile is far safer than other government-approved anti-cancer drugs, says a federal judge who allowed interstate shipment of the controversial

drug to continue. Friday, U.S. District Judge Luther Bohanon returned the issue of the drug to the federal appeals court but stayed his order pending a review by the U.S. 10th Circuit Court of Appeals in De-Bohanon refused to withdraw a

restraining order prohibiting the Food and Drug Administration from interfering with interstate shipment of laetrile. Bohanon, who has stood up for laetrile users in the past, also de-clined to rescind his order allow-

ing laetrile to be used by terminally ill cancer patients. Last year, the U.S. Supreme Court called for a test of the effectiveness of laetrile and discarded constitutional issues of the use

The 10th Circuit Court rule last year that laetrile was under FDA jurisdiction and or not claim protection of a "gra father clause," despite supporter who claimed laetrile was not and Bohanon then received the case from the 10th Circuit Cour
