FTC report shows as significant increase DETROIT direct c in low tar cigarettes y on an up to how root king-size filter and Tareyton Uk GM prev.

WASHINGTON — The Feder-

al Trade Commission said in a report issued Monday that there has been a significant increase in the number of U.S. brand cigarettes boasting low tar and nicotine contents

The report updated the com-mission's last survey — dated De-cember 1979 — and publishes for the first time the carbon monoxide content of cigarettes

'Today's test results show a significant increase in the number of cigarette brands with low tar and nicotine levels," said an FTC statement. The report said 125 of the 187

brands tested have no more than 15 milligrams of tar, compared with 103 such brands in December 1979. The number of brands with 1 milligram of nicotine or less

is 111, up from 101 in 1979. Tar and nicotine have been linked to lung cancer and other diseases

The last three surgeon general's reports on cigarette smoking suggested carbon monoxide may interfere with pregnancies, increase symptoms in patients with heart and lung disease and contribute to hardening of the arteries.



Carlton, Benson & Hedges and Tareyton were the labels with the lowest tar, nicotine and carbon monoxide contents of 187 U.S.

brands, the FTC said. On tar content, the report said Carlton king-size filter cigarettes (hard pack) had the lowest con-tent, 0.5 milligrams.

After that, with 1 milligram each, were Carlton king-size filter menthols, Benson & Hedges regular filter (hard pack), Carlton the report shows.
