## A&M rural office Lo will help distribute census information Ap

The Department of Rural is to distribute the census of Sociology at Texas A&M University has been selected by the Texas 2000 Agency in the governor's office to play a key role in disseminating 1980 census information.

The department, along with the Texas State Library and the Texas Natural Resource Information System, will be the primary disseminating agencies of the State Data Center Program. The program, which involves a cooperative arrangement between the state and the U.S. Bureau of the Census, is intended to increase the availability and accessibility of the 1980 census data. The three agencies will be responsible for providing information on population characteristics and changes, trends in Texas.

Most of the census data are not vet available, however, because of lawsuits pending against the U.S. Bureau of the Census," said Dr. Steve Murdock, head of Texas A&M's Department of Rural Sociology, a part of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station. The only information currently available is the redistricting data which provides population counts by ethnicity for all units of government and census areas in Texas.

"Data on sex, age, income, occupation and other characteristics of the population will not be available until late fall of 1981 or early 1982," Murdock said. Until then Murdock and two

other Texas A&M demographers, Drs. R.L. Skrabanek and Patricia Guseman, are using the redistricting data to prepare several analyses of patterns of population change in Texas for the Texas 2000 staff and readying the system that
