Dr. Larry Howard, director of the State Crime Lab, said Tuesday that most of the fiber comparison

needed because of increased media coverage.





United Press International AMARILLO — Dismissal of the former district attorney's libel suit against the Amarillo Globe News vindicates the newspaper's efforts in behalf of the public interest, the paper's general mana-

ger believes. U.S. District Judge Robert Hill in Dallas has granted the newspaper's motion for a summary judgment in the case filed by former District Attorney Tom Curtis, ruling in favor of the newspaper without a full trial.

Globe News General Manager James L. Whyte said Tuesday the newspaper was pleased with Hill's ruling.

'Certainly the court's decision last Friday vindicates the position we took in support of the public interest," he said

"It is neither easy nor pleasant to challenge a powerful elected official. The newspaper and sever-al of us associated with it were subjected to considerable vitriolic criticism over a period of years.

"To have our efforts supported in such as a manner, however, makes all of the difficulties more worthwhile. We are grateful to our excellent legal counsel as well as to the court," Whyte said. Hill gave Curtis 30 days to appeal the ruling handed down
