## State Truck drivers request higher weight limits on highways

**LITTLE ROCK** — Highway Commissioner James Branyan says he is convinced Arkansas businesses need an 80,000-pound truck weight limit if they are to survive, but someone will have to pay for the roads they use.

Although no formal vote was taken, the Truck Weight Study Commission adjourned Tuesday in apparent agreement that Arkansas' truck weight limit will have to be raised. The members had just heard five hours of testimony from representatives of agriculture, industry, shipping and transportation, who all said Arkansas' higher transportation costs place them at a disadvantage in the marketplace.

Two poultry industries — Tyson Foods and Valmac Industries — may build new headquar-

ters outside Arkansas if the 73,280-pound truck weight limit is not raised to 80,000 pounds as in other states, company officials said.

"If we cannot remain competitive, we cannot remain in business," said Richard Bell, vice president of Riceland Foods at Stuttgart. "An efficient transportation system is essential to our remaining competitive."

Branyan said he has never opposed the higher truck weight limit, as long as the legislature finds some way to finance highway repairs that will be needed when the heavier trucks hit the roads. The Highway Commission has estimated the extra cost at \$60 million a year, a figure disputed in many quarters.

The Truck Weight Commission, which will make recommendations to the Legislature, has discussed higher license fees for trucks and a higher tax on diesel fuel to increase highway revenue. More concrete proposals are to be made at a meeting July 9.

Most of the businessmen who

testified said they were willing to pay their fair share of increased highway costs. Highway Commissioner Raymond Pritchett, also a member of the Truck Weight Commission, said he believes the drivers of passenger cars feel the same way.

"The essence is going to come in defining 'fair share,'" he said.

But John Reith of Washington, director of the Department of Interstate Cooperation for the American Trucking Associations Inc., said no other state's highway officials had demanded \$60 million to repair highways.

Reith said the Arkansas Highway Commission's conclusions were based on a 20-year-old study that was never intended to be used to figure highway damage.

Gov. Frank White, who strongly supports higher truck weights, has also disputed the \$60 million figure. He says he fears Arkansas will become an economic "island" with its lower truck weight as businesses move out of the state and truckers avoid it.

Only one state — Illinois — still

has a truck weight limit of 80,000 pounds, and it is considering a change. Tennessee also voted to raise their limits this year.

N. M. Shell, manager of Texas River terminals at Pine Bluff, Helena and said shippers have been voted to raise their limits rather than in Arkansas.

John Ed Anthony said the timber industry under a severe hardship cannot match the low costs enjoyed in the Texas and Louisiana.

"It's like asking the state to play Texas, LSU and with 10 men," he said.

The Arkansas Legislature year passed a temporary law allows trucks hauling agricultural products a higher limit. But even the Truck Weight permit makes the new

## Neighborhood theft ring learns art of stealing

**IRVING** — Police today were searching for a 20th century fagin who they charge schooled 10 boys, ages 10 to 16, in the fine points of theft.

The boys stole about \$10,000 worth of gold, silver, jewelry, guns, construction wire, small radios, keys, pencils and cowboy hats, police said.

"The man was schooling them," said detective Mike Weger. "He would tell them to be sure and get silver. He would tell them how to look for silver, how to turn it over and read whether it was sterling or

14 karat, and not to mess with the rest."

Weger said the man warned his students police eventually would catch up with them and that he would "get them" if any of them identified him, Weger said.

To date none of the boys has divulged the man's name.

Six of the boys — who all lived in the same neighborhood and generally operated within walking distances of their homes — have been arrested in the case and four others likely will be arrested shortly, Weger said.

The gang told police of two brothers in the group who helped them to the state to the fagin. The unidentified fagin will be charged on a later offense, possession of a juana, since none of the property has been made making it difficult to receive charges, police said.

**DALLAS** — An apparent rash of deaths under anesthesia during dental operations has drawn the attention of the state Board of Dental Examiners, says the board's executive director.

The board is investigating five recent deaths involving dental operations, board executive director

William Nail said. Two cases involving tooth extractions — a girl in Fort Worth who died in a suburban hospital who lapsed into a coma focussed attention on the deaths.

The two most recent under investigation are year-old Shonia Crumpton Worth, who lapsed into a coma and later died when a tube became dislodged, and year-old Vikram Bhatia, who died after a cardiac arrest while under anesthesia and was still on life support Tuesday.
