Battleship marked for facelift

United Press International BREMERTON, Wash. — The battleship New Jersey, which saw service in three wars, came out of mothballs Monday to be towed to California for a \$330 million facelift to transform it into a modern fighting ship laden with missiles.

The trip to the Long Beach Naval Shipyard for the 21-month modernization project was expected to take about 11 days.

Secretary of the Navy John F. Lehman Jr. and other U.S. Navy officials hope the recall of the 888-foot New Jersey to active duty will go so well that Congress will fund

the revitalization of all four of the Iowa class battlewagons.

Of the four, the New Jersey and Missouri were mothballed at the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton. The Iowa and Wisconsin are sealed and tied up at the Philadelphia Naval Shipyard.

The New Jersey was the last of the four to see service — 328 days of bombardment support duty off South Vietnam in 1969 — and was in better condition although it had been idled at the Bremerton yard for more than a decade.

The Navy has estimated it would cost another \$400 million

each to renovate the other three battleships. Lehman said two battleships can be modernized for the cost of building one new frigate and renovation takes less time than building a new ship.

Congress has provided funds to begin restoration of the New Jersey and Iowa. No funds have been provided as yet for the Missouri and Wisconsin.

The Iowa class ships, which have a 12-inch thick girdle of steel beneath their sleek outer hulls, were the largest battleships built except for the two Yamato class

battleships Japan built during World War II.

The New Jersey still will return to active duty in 1983. But later, the Navy expected to remove the rear gun turret to make room for a landing deck for jet VSTOL (vertical takeoff and landing) fighters.

The New Jersey, at 58,000 tons when fully loaded for battle, has a speed of 33 knots. Even after the ship was first commissioned it ranks among the fastest in the U.S. fleet.

Elephants happy in Texas home

United Press International GRAND PRAIRIE — In the overcrowded game preserves of South Africa, where officials have too little food for too many animals, the term they use is "depopulate."

That's a euphemism for shoot and kill.

In the early days, when conser-

vationists worldwide were becoming concerned that some animals were on the brink of extinction, preserves were created to give select species a haven.

As the years passed and more animals were packed into limited areas, officials were forced to "depopulate" the old and sick. Last year, however, according to the International Wildlife Park in north central Texas, the need to "depopulate" became so critical that even the young and healthy were targeted for destruction.

But as the need arose to drastically reduce herds, the International Animals Exchange found a need for the spare animals. So, thanks to the exchange, 17 young elephants that would have been shot five months ago in Africa are now playing around their own swimming pool in Texas.

"They're having a ball," said Pat Carr, spokesman for the drive-

through park in the Dallas suburb of Grand Prairie. "They're acting like big pigs. They have shade trees and we hung some tarps from big posts so they could get under them. They have their own lake. They're fine."

The elephants, the youngest 1 1/2 years old and the oldest only 4, are from Kruger National Park in South Africa, a large preserve that nevertheless had an elephant population too large for its space.

"They've had to cull out some in order for the rest to have enough to eat," said Michael Hunt, vice president of the Texas park. "When we started getting involved last year there were problems because they were just exporting adult animals. They started de-populating babies."

To prevent those killings, last year Hunt brought 33 African elephants to the 840 acre Grand Prairie park — more than the park

could realistically handle in the long term — hoping they could be placed in zoos around the country.

"There turned out to be a demand that anticipated," said. "To date we've found places for all but three. We think we're able to find places for all of them."

A total of 47 elephants targeted for "de-population" last year by the preserve, but a change managed to save 17 — 17 coming to Texas, 17 remaining 30 divided between preserves in Japan and another in Africa.

Although some of the elephants were bruised during a 5-week sea trip to Houston, overland leg to Grand Prairie forcing them to be within the herd until they are able to compete for food — the herd adapted quickly to their surroundings.
