NFL camps begin to liven up

United Press International Gene Klein, owner of the San Diego Chargers, says wide receiver John Jefferson is welcome, if he pleases, to run his next pattern right past the training camp door.

"John Jefferson has the right to do what he wants," Klein said Monday, referring to Jefferson's desire to restructure his contract. "If he wants to pursue another career, he can go right ahead and do that. We don't want anybody out at camp who doesn't want to play football."

Jefferson, an All-Pro who with Charlie Joiner and Kellen Wins-low gave San Diego one of the most dynamic receiving corps in football, has avoided camp, requesting instead to receive money now that was deferred to future years under the contract.

He signed a series of seven oneyear contracts when he joined San Diego in 1978.

Klein said the Chargers' policy is not to renegotiate contracts.

Jefferson isn't the only Charger who would like his contract renegotiated. Several other veter-ans, including tight end Winslow, the team's leading receiver last season, would like to have new

Jefferson is the only Charger veteran not in camp. Fourth-round draft choice Amos Lawrence, a running back from North Carolina, is the only rookie who has not reported, and the Chargers haven't heard from him.

their players probably will require veteran running back Allan Clark and rookie free-agent running back Rich Villella.


