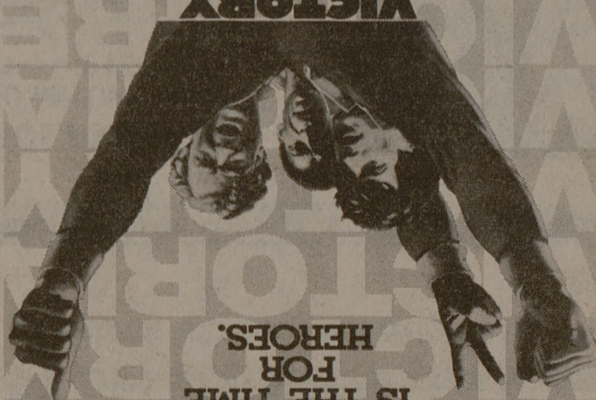

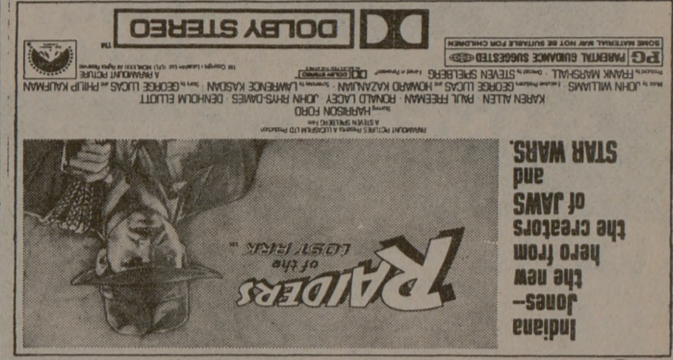

**WASHINGTON** — CIA Director William Casey — saying "it's going to be a cakewalk" — met behind closed doors Wednesday with a Senate committee to answer questions about his past business dealings and his stewardship of the CIA.

A smiling and almost cocky Casey, flanked by a half dozen bodyguards, arrived at the Capitol precisely at 9:30 a.m. EDT for the hearing he requested before the Senate Intelligence Committee.

"I've been through six of these before," Casey said, referring to his previous confirmation hearings for the CIA post, Securities and Exchange Commission and other government jobs.

Spurning more discreet entrances to the Senate committee room high up under the Capitol cupola, Casey, 68, came in by the main door on the Senate side and waved cheerfully to reporters.

Casey, who drove over after a brief White House meeting that apparently did not include the president, seems to have been in a good mood.
