Tuesday, July 28 — The Texas A&M System Board of Regents approves a proposal to tighten enrollment standards, effective with the fall semester 1982. The new standards include increased mini-mum Scholastic Aptitude Test scores for incoming freshmen and increased minimum grade point ratios for transfer students.

Regents also approve operating budgets totaling a record \$528,605,983 for Texas A&M's four universities, seven state agencies and System offices. Another proposal approved by the Board appropriates \$90,000 for the removal of the All Faiths Chapel roof and installation of a new roof made of anodized aluminum.

Board members also agree to establish a University-operated shuttle bus system to begin operation in September 1982. They appropriate \$1.4 million to purchase buses and \$1.1 million to build




