United Press International AMARILLO — Bill Murray, plaintiff in the 1963 Supreme Court case that banned mandatory prayer and Bible readings in public schools, has been prevented from distributing religious mate-rials at a junior high school.

Murray, son of avowed atheist Madalyn Murray O'Hair who filed the suit, and Cecil Todd, director of the Revival Fires Ministries of

Jopa, Mo., were told Monday by the chool's principal to leave volunarily or be removed by leave the material, then left the school grounds.

Murray and Todd were distributing folders with the Ten Commandments inscribed on the front and the Lord's Prayer on the back. Todd said he was leading a drive to get voluntary prayer and Bible reading back into the classroom.

"If we continue to allow the supremacy of minority viewpoints, before long we will have students that belong to the Communist Party and who are against the teaching of free enterprise," Todd said. "The Pledge of Allegiance will be forbidden.

He and Murray said the folders would help fulfill the personal and spiritual needs of the students.
