SWC survives first week

Texas Christian University coach F.A. Dry is happy to have this week off, but Texas A&M coach Tom Wilson would probably just as soon see his troops in action again instead of having to sit on the bench for a while.

It all has to do with last weekend's results, which for TCU were favorable.

Dry had big hopes for his Horned Frogs last weekend at Auburn, but TCU fell behind early and eventually lost by eight points.

"It was a winnable ball game," Dry said Monday, "even in the fourth quarter. The problem was we didn't tackle in the first half."

"Our players must learn that they have to play hard throughout the game. I expect our team to win. And because we didn't win our first game doesn't mean I've changed my mind about that."

Dry had special mention for receiver Stanley Washington, who caught eight passes including a couple of typical acrobatic-like grabs.

"I've never been around a receiver who can judge the flight of the ball in the air and jump to it," Dry said. "He's an amazing receiver."

TCU does not play again until Sept. 19 when the Frogs meet Texas-Arlington.

"I'm glad we have it," said Dry. "We've never been able to have an open date at this time of the year and I think it will help us improve some things."

Wilson knows that some things need improving at Texas A&M, but his team showed such character in fighting from behind against California last week that he is anxious for his players to face another foe.

But A&M also is idle until Sept. 19 when the Aggies travel to Boston College.

"We found out a lot about our team's attitude and character," said Wilson, referring to A&M's 29-28 decision over California. "It was so important that we got off on a positive note."

"We knew we could move the football and the only thing we had to do was keep Cal from making any big plays on offense. They had not moved it consistently, but they had fooled us with some trick plays."

At SMU, meanwhile, coach Ron Meyer said his team made the typical number of mistakes expected for an opening game in the Mustangs' 48-0 rout of Texas-Arlington.

"We had 15 penalties against us," Meyer said. "Some of those were turned down, but they all added up to 120 yards. We left the ball on the ground nine times. Some of those were not ruled fumbles, but when the calls are marginal they can go against you so we count them in our coaching records."

"We threw two interceptions and had six turnovers. Those are things we are going to have to repair."

"The thing that was encouraging, though was that our defense

was dominating. Last year Texas-Arlington moved the ball well against us and this year we were pretty dominate."

Texas-Arlington managed only 30 yards total offense against SMU — 17 on the ground and 13 in the air — and produced a mere five first downs.

In Lubbock, Texas Tech coach Jerry Moore said his team faced the danger of allowing Colorado's recent misfortune cloud the issue in next Saturday's opener for the Red Raiders.

Tech will meet the Buffaloes in Boulder.

"If you aren't careful," said Moore, "you will let their win-loss record over the past few years overshadow the talent they do have. I know our people need to see a different colored jersey."

"Colorado will be quicker and more experienced defensively than they were last year. I'm sure they have worked hard to strengthen their defense."

Colorado gave up an average of 41 points a game last season.
