McCatty pitches A's past Rangers, 3-0

United Press International OAKLAND — Oakland A's pitcher Steve McCatty doesn't want to talk about his chances of winning this year's American League Cy Young award. Instead, McCatty says, his goal is plain and simple — to pitch in the World

Hough was relieved in the eighth when the A's added two runs on a single by Wayne Gross, walks to Mike Heath, a groundout that moved the runners up, a safe ty squeeze bunt by Rob Picciolo and an RBI single by Henderson.

The victory put the A's in first place in the American League West just percentage points ahead of the Kansas City Royals.


