United Press International Following Wisconson's 21-14 victory over Michigan — the topranked pre-season team — Notre Dame catapulted into the No. 1 spot on the strength of a 27-9 victory over Louisiana State.

And Michigan, which fell to No. 12, hosts the Fighting Irish Saturday in a nationally televised game scheduled to begin at noon
