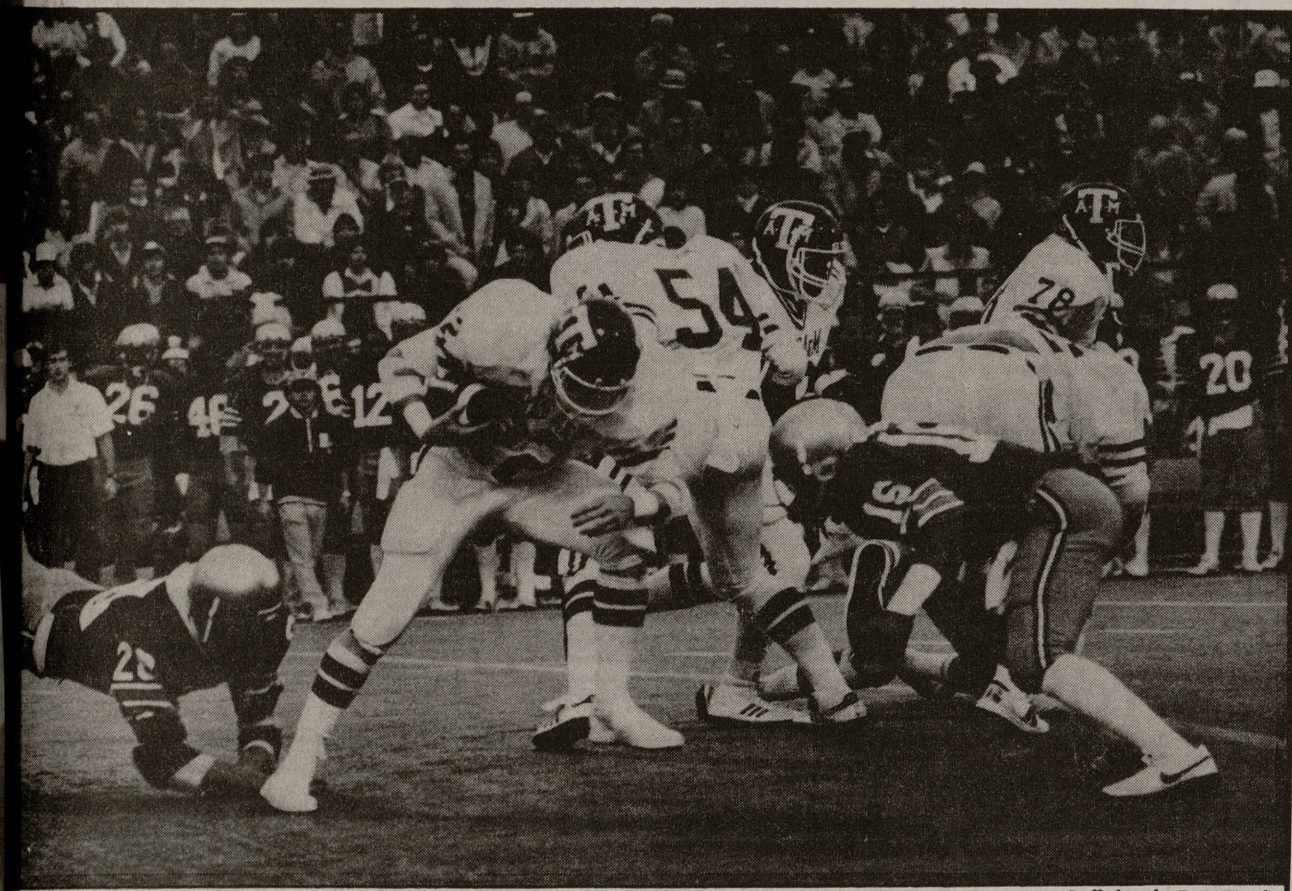

Soccer team loses close games

Telmo Franco knows he doesn't have the best soccer team in the world.

But the coach of the Texas A&M University men's soccer team also knows that his athletes are proud enough to play all their games even if they don't have a varsity label.

Amid the news that three teams have cancelled their matches with Texas A&M because of the Aggies' non-varsity status, Franco's team played four opponents in the last two weeks. Although the team has won only one of those matches, Franco says he's still optimistic.

"I think we have a chance to win against any team we play. The team is beginning to play well ... a team. Just like any other team and to choose six opponents in the U.S. District Court. Thompson said, 'The Aggies spent the past weekend traveling to Provo, Utah to play Canada's University of Victoria and Brigham Young University. Texas A&M lost 1-0 to the Canadian team and 2-1 to BYU. Franco said he was satisfied with his team's performance. The team played well, despite the altitude and the long bus trip,' he said.

Sunday, the Aggies drove from Provo to Denton to play North Texas State University, but lost again by a score of 1-0. However, Franco said his team played admirably against the 20th-ranked team in the nation.

"We played well, and the kids

are showing that they're playing as a team," he said. "Our defense played a tremendous game. Actually, that was really the basis of the team (effort). The coach of North Texas was very surprised, because he thought his team was going to run over us."

NTSU All-American Frank Monreal scored the only goal about 30 minutes into the first half of the match, which drew about 1,000 spectators.

Franco cited the play of sophomore goalie Xavier Holguin as the

key to the defensive struggle.

"Absolutely, he is professional material. Being a former professional, I can see professional material," he said.

The Aggies host the University of Texas Sunday at 2 p.m. in their first home match of the season. It will be the first Southwest Conference Soccer League game of the season for Texas A&M, and Franco feels it's realistic to say his team may win the conference title. However, he said, the Aggies

must concentrate on UT before they consider a league title.

"They always have a good team. I don't know how strong a team they have (this year), but we don't ever take Texas lightly," he said.

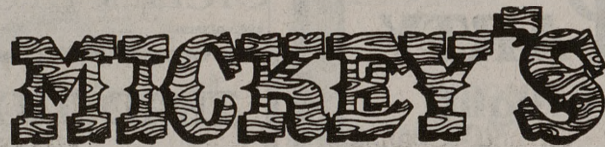
