

Gold standard use discouraged

United Press International DALLAS — Conservative economist Karl Brunner warns returning the country to the gold standard may actually aggravate inflation and unemployment instead of reducing them.

Brunner, who teaches economics at the University of Rochester, told the Dallas Times Herald that better than linking money to gold would be to increase the money supply at a set percentage each year. He said such a monet-ary, "rule" would stabilize prices

and reduce unemployment.
"The gold standard does not anchor prices," said Brunner, who is co-chairman of a group of conservative economists known as Shadow Open Market Committee. "All it does is ensure that inflation will be the same in various countries. You still need to control the money supply to control infla-
