## No. 1 Trojans to test OU

Now it's Oklahoma's turn.

After sitting idly by and watching Michigan and Notre Dame fall from the No. 1 rating in the last two weeks, the second-rated Sooners get their chance at No. 1 Saturday when they visit Southern California before an expected crowd of 90,000 at Los Angeles Coliseum and a national television audience.

"They're awesome," said Oklahoma Coach Barry Switzer. He said his inexperienced defense will have to stop Southern Cal's I-formation attack powered by tailback Marcus Allen, the nation's leading rusher.

"The key to the ball game is that our six sophomores and our defense are going to have to play far above their ability," he said. "What frightens me is that their offensive line is giant."

Southern Cal Coach John Robinson says this is the kind of game that makes college football so exciting.

"We've attracted the attention of the whole nation," said Robinson, "and that's what makes this game fun. But it's so early in the season it's very, very premature to identify either team with greatness."

Robinson said he's concerned about facing Oklahoma's potent wish-bone attack.

"It's certainly our first concern," he said. "It's an enormous change of style from what our players are used to."

West Virginia 28, Colorado State 21 — Now that the Mountaineers are in the Top 20, they plan to stay awhile, at least until they meet Pittsburgh Oct. 10.

Mississippi State 24, Florida 21 — This may be the year Mississippi State finds itself in the Sugar Bowl.

North Carolina 35, Boston College 14 — How many touchdowns will North Carolina running back Kelvin Bryant score this week?

Alabama 24, Vanderbilt 17 — Vandy quarterback Whit Taylor may throw 50 passes to keep the Commodores in contention, but Alabama's rushing game will eventually take its toll.

Others: Georgia Tech 20, Memphis State 14; LSU 31, Rice 21; North Carolina State 28, Maryland 17; Tennessee 24, Auburn 21; Duke 19, Virginia 13; Virginia Tech 27, Wake Forest 22.

### MIDWEST

UCLA 27, Iowa 14 — The Bruins make it two straight over Big Ten teams.

Michigan 42, Navy 7 — Michigan will make short work of undermanned Middies.

Penn State 24, Nebraska 21 — Penn State Coach Joe Paterno has been waiting to get back at Huskers' after last year's loss.

Notre Dame 34, Purdue 17 — The Fighting Irish begin their climb back into the Top 10. Others: Cincinnati 23, Rutgers 20; Iowa State 27, Kent State 17; Kansas 21, Kentucky 14; Kansas State 21, Drake 19; Michigan State 28, Bowling Green 10; Minnesota 31, Oregon State 14; Missouri 35, Louisville 12; Northwestern 22, Utah 21; Wisconsin 27, Western Michigan 21.

### SOUTHWEST

Texas 21, Miami (Fla.) 14 — If this game was in Miami, it would be a different story.

## Arkansas-Ole Miss matchup renews feud

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Mississippi coach Steve Sloan and Arkansas coach Lou Holtz said they were trying to approach Saturday night's game the same as any other on their schedules.

The Ole Miss-Razorback rivalry was fierce at one time, but the two teams broke off the

series after 1961. The Rebels and Razorbacks rarely saw eye-to-eye on anything and they can't even agree on how the series stands.

According to Arkansas, Ole Miss leads 14-13, but the Rebels contend they lead by 15-12. The disputed game occurred in 1914. Mississippi won on the field but Arkansas con-

tended the Rebels used an ineligible player and considered the game a forfeit.

Asked if the rivalry meant more to the fans than the players, Sloan said: "It's a little hard for me to answer. I would say for this first game, possibly that's true."

"Our situation is we're just trying to win another game,"

Sloan said. "We think this re-newing of the Arkansas-Mississippi series will go on to be a big game if we're good enough to play with Arkansas."

Asked about Arkansas' attitude toward the game, Holtz said, "You just try to go about and approach it like you do any other game with thorough preparation."

"You have to be careful you don't try to get your players an emotional high because every high you have, you're going to have a depth of depression and we can't afford to have any depths going into the Southwest Conference," Holtz said. "We know it's a big game. It's an important game for every other game that we play."
