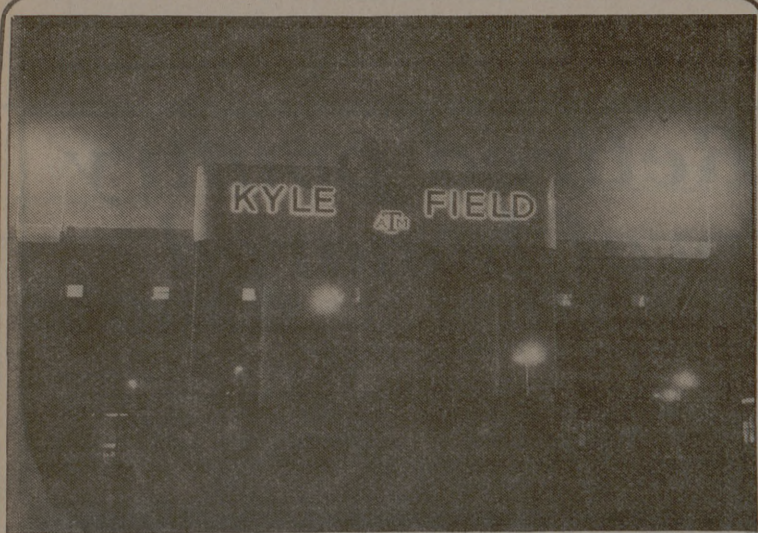

Two Texas A&M professors have been named to 1981-82 Halliburton Chairs of Engineering. They are Dr. Gerald Morrison, associate professor of mechanical engineering, and Dr. Philip Allen, associate professor of electrical engineering.

Dr. Robert H. Page, dean of the engineering college, this week accepted a check for \$20,000 from the Halliburton Education Foundation. This is the 17th annual grant awarded the University's College of Engineering by the foundation. Presenting the check were Edward J. Byrne, B. E. Stallworth, David G.
