Prof at Rice cautions Duke of Nixon papers

HOUSTON — A Rice University history professor, who has done research in presidential libraries, said there would be no point in Duke University becoming a storehouse for former President Nixon's papers if no one is allowed access to the documents.

Dr. Francis Loewenheim advised Duke University administrators to determine which of Nixon's papers will be available to the public before agreeing to house a proposed Nixon library.

"It's no use becoming a very celebrated storehouse for records which nobody can see," said Loewenheim, author of "Roosevelt and Churchill, Their Secret Wartime Correspondence."

He said: "I am not sure the people at Duke understand what it is they may be getting and the circumstances under which they may be getting the materials. Nixon's associates cannot guarantee what they will be able to hand over."

There has been dissent about operating a Nixon museum.

"The point about the Nixon museum is irrelevant," Loewenheim said. "They have

museums in every presidential library where I've been. At these museums they have nothing more than memorabilia. The people who come to them are high school students and tourists. That's fine."

Loewenheim's research discovered that President Eisenhower secretly taped conversations in the Oval Office starting in 1953, and that President Truman twice considered dropping an atom bomb on China and the Soviet Union during the Korean War.
