College Bowl, a question-and-answer game, will begin Wednesday in Rudder Tower. Games sponsored by the MSC Council will be played every Wednesday night in October.
More than 20 teams have registered for Texas A&M University competition which will feature questions on topics such as American and European history, science, sports, current events, trivia, fine arts and literature.
Two teams of four students compete in each 14-minute game. Each team member controls a table buzzer to signal that he can answer the toss-up questions. If a member answers correctly, he and his team members may confer on the answers to two or three bonus questions which they are then given, Kathy Westerfield, College Bowl chairman said.
Three to five seconds are allowed to answer each question,

she said. If a player buzzes before the question is read completely and answers incorrectly, his team loses points.
Each correctly answered question is worth 20 or 30 points, Westerfield said. The average team score for a game is 200 points. A scorekeeper will post team scores as well as keep individual scores, she said.
College Bowl questions are prepared by the College Bowl Co. which organizes nationwide college tournaments, Westerfield said.
Winning teams will advance to winners' brackets to play other winning teams, Westerfield said. The losing teams will compete for a consolation title.
This year's winning team from Texas A&M will go to regional competition in Austin, Westerfield said. The regional team will consist of the winning team and the four high-scoring players.
"We hope to do a lot better in regionals this year," she said.

Texas A&M has participated in the College Bowl for the last 20 years.
The regional winners will compete in the national tournament which will be televised.
Any full-time student is eligible to play. This year's teams are made up of members from fraternities and fraternities and student organizations, she said.
The campus winners receive trophies, and winners' names are printed on a plaque for the Memorial Student Center, she said.
The final competition, Nov. 15 is open to the public. Audiences for the preceding games are screened so competing teams can't see other matches, she said.
Trophies and certificates are awarded to the winning team, officials and participants at an appreciation banquet after the competition.
Information concerning the date and place of tournament games will be available at Rudder Tower, Westerfield said.

MSC Council adopts budget revisions

The MSC Council approved seven committee budget revisions Monday night in order to keep the council within its budget. That budget was passed by Student Government last spring.
Cuts in student service fee allocations were partly responsible for the revisions, Todd Norwood, vice president for finance, said. He said the revised budgets also reflect goals of new committee officers. MSC committee officers were chosen last April, after the 1981-82 budget

was set.
The committees with reduced budgets are:
— MSC Political Forum, from \$58,183 to \$44,699; a decrease of 23 percent.
— MSC Video, from \$12,475 to \$12,275; a decrease of 1.6 percent.
— MSC Hospitality, from \$17,159 to \$16,284; a decrease of 5 percent.
— MSC Great Issues, from \$27,362 to \$26,862; a decrease of 1.8 percent.
— MSC Opera and Performing Arts Society, from \$205,250 to \$204,750; down 0.2 percent.
Income for MSC Council projects and administration was also lowered because of reduced student service fee allocations. The allocation was reduced \$5,631, from \$28,103 to \$22,472, a change of 20 percent.
The council plans to recover some of this loss by soliciting additional donations for its Madrigal Dinners, annual Christmas feasts and plays, so

that total income is reduced only \$1,566.
MSC Video's portion of student service fees was cut \$200 but the committee said it plans to make up the difference from MSC Basement concession. The Basement, when it reopens, will use a television screen belonging to MSC Video.
MSC Travel's budget shows a jump from \$157,940 to \$176,915, an increase of 12 percent. The committee is planning a tour of China, and the expenses for this trip, about \$90,000, were accounted for in the budget. However, by other trips, totaling around \$68,000 have been cancelled. None of these expenses will be paid with University funds.
The committees plan to operate within their new lowered budgets by cutting back on some programs and by reducing such expenses as advertising brochures and newsletters.
