federal governments concerning policy and that was the reason they were "overly cautious" in commenting.

"They are having a difficult time figuring out what the program is," Clements said. "They have seen no final draft and I haven't either. Until they see a final draft, they will not be reluctant in an overwhelming sense

and say that they like it."
