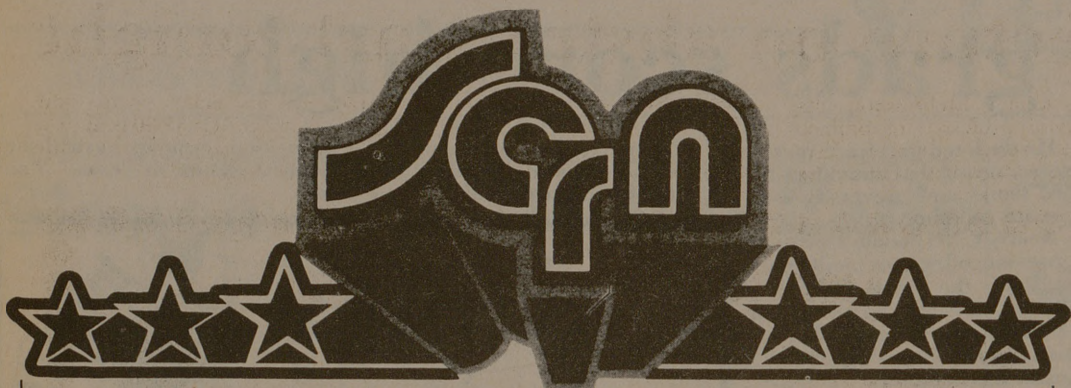
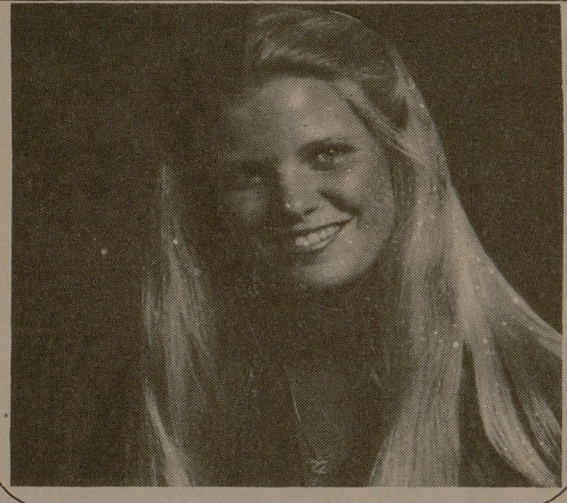

The Residence Hall Association has scheduled a general meeting tonight at 7 in 102 Academic & Agency Building.

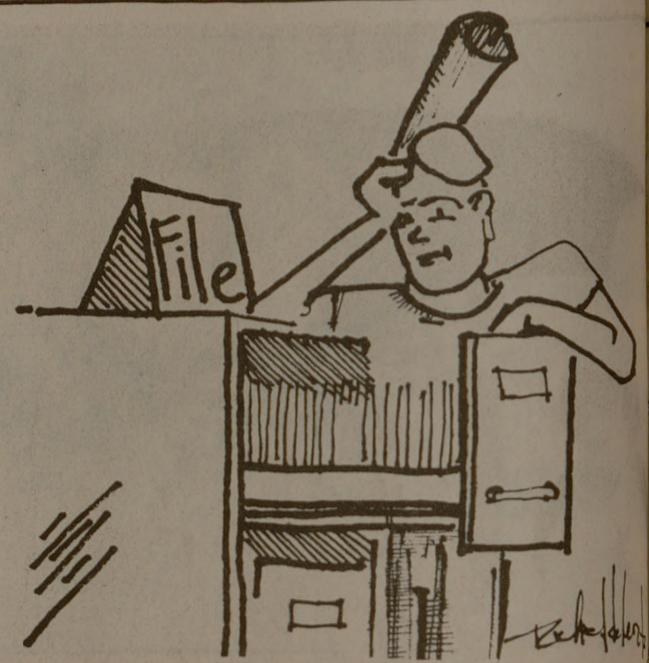
Tim Ryan, president of RHA, said members will be discussing consolidation of the dorm quiz files into one main file to be located at the library.

Holly Haines, quiz file chairman at McFadden dorm, said various quiz file chairmen are working through their own dorm coun-

cils now in order to get permission to move the files to the library. She said the move is tentatively planned for sometime in November, but various issues brought out by dorm representatives must be decided before any move can occur.

Emma Perry, assistant library professor, said approval for the move would also have to come from the library council before anything could happen.

RHA will also be hearing from representatives with the Aggie blood drive, Ryan said.



Ground cover near dorms trimmed to rid area of rats

Dorms 1 through 12 won't be described as "ratty" anymore if the Grounds Maintenance Department has anything to do with it.

Those dorms were cited as having a rat problem in a Student Senate bill authored last month by Laura Furr, senator from Spence/Briggs/Underwood, and Tracy Cox, graduate business senator.

"Rats come up from the steam tunnel," Furr said. "Last year, we had one come into the hall."

She added: "Stray cats are starting to hang around our dorm."

Furr said the ground cover around the dorms created a nesting place for the rats, and the bill called for the Grounds Maintenance Department to clear away

this ground cover.

"We have a lot of ivy, especially when it rains," Furr said.

Eugene H. Ray, director of the department, agreed that the ground cover causes a problem in the dorm area. "Any time you have any type of vegetation," he said, "it's going to afford a haven for creatures."

"We have taken the ground cover down to a level which won't offer a refuge to the rodents."

Ray said the department would try to keep the ivy and other ground cover cut to four inches around Dorms 1, 2 and 3.

"We've not been advised that there's a problem in the rest of the Corps dorm area," he said.

"If we take away all the vegetation ... we have a problem with aesthetics," he said. "We're going

to try to keep it at that level."

The Rat Control Bill also called for the department to bait weekly, instead of once or twice a month.

"We don't do rodent-treating wholesale over the campus," Ray said. "We try to treat it on a problem basis."

The grounds department has doubled and tripled its baiting in the area around Dorms 1, 2 and 3, Ray said. He added that in checking the area, his men had not found the bait being consumed in great amounts.

Furr said that due to the department's work in the area the

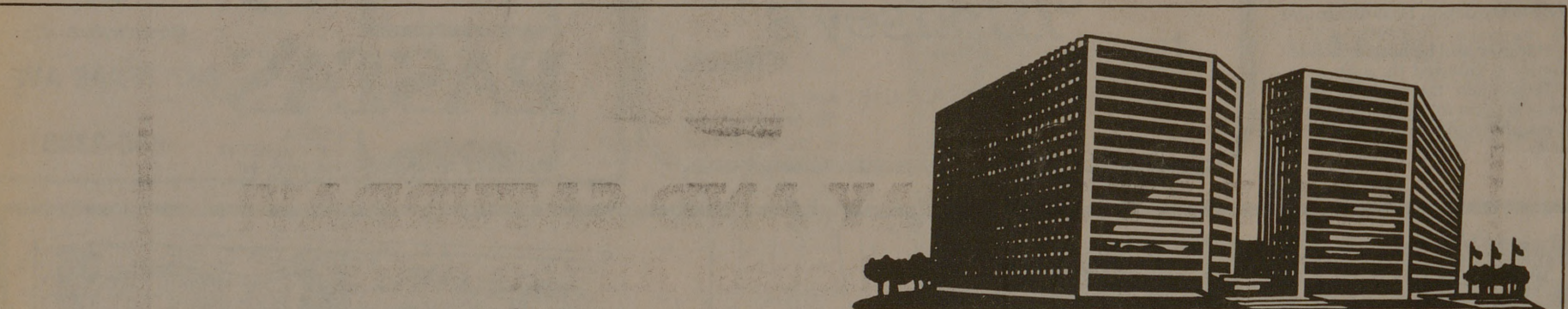
Student Services Committee was killing the bill.

Ray said the dorm residents would have to cooperate also in order to eliminate the problem.

"When you find a Hibachi there with grease and meat on you're inviting this (a rat problem)," he said. "The residents have to do their part."

"My people have found rat eaten pies and cakes through the windows."

"They (rats) are going to go food."
