Ags put Cougars' lights out in third one-point win of year

If every one-point football game the Texas Aggies have played this

year aged every Aggie by 10 years, the life expectancy would drop dramatically.

Saturday's 7-6 victory over Houston, the most electrifying yet, probably cut that expectancy in half. It certainly gave the fourth largest crowd (66,569) in Kyle Field history something to remember the 1981 Texas Aggies by.

Behind the fine running of quarterback Gary Kubiak, the Aggies put just enough points on the board for their fourth victory against one loss — something that could bring them a national ranking.

The Cougars took the opening kickoff at their own 26 and promptly went nowhere, thanks to the fine play of linebacker Mike Little and defensive end Keith Baldwin.

After a 33-yard punt by Lonnie Stokes, the Aggies took off like a rocket. On second down, running back Johnny Hector took a Kubiak

handoff behind the blocks of quick tackle Matt Darwin and quick guard Kent Adams, turned on the afterburner and scampered around right end for 46 yards. Strong safety Donnie Love ran him down from behind at the Houston 25.

Love was the Cougar workhorse on defense, finishing the day with seven tackles, at least four of which prevented touchdowns or long gains.

Three plays netted the Aggies nine yards and David Hardy came on to attempt a 33-yard field goal from Kyle Stuard's hold.

However, the snap was low and Stuard rolled out to pass the ball with several Cougars in pursuit. Stuard was knocked down for a 12-yard loss, separating his shoulder on the play. The sophomore had to be helped from the field and will be lost for the season.

The Aggie defense, playing perhaps its most complete game of the year, shut down the Cougars and forced them to punt.

The Cougars didn't get a first down until the 1:04 mark of the first quarter, that coming on a personal foul penalty giving them the ball on the Aggie 22.

Four plays later the Cougars were on the Texas A&M 3-yard line facing a third and goal situation. Quarterback Lionel Wilson rolled out under pressure from linebacker Bobby Stroger, and tackle Keith Guthrie finished him off at the 21 for a 18-yard loss.

Houston head coach Bill Yeoman then called on freshman tight end Pat Franklin to boot a 37-yard field goal, but the attempt fell short.

Yeoman called on Franklin because regular place-kicker Jeff Shaffer was suffering from a deep thigh bruise and was not able to kick.

Neither team was able to the ball consistently through the first half, although Houston drove deep into Aggie territory two more times before the half.

The first Cougar drive, in the direction of Wilson, stalled the A&M 25 on a fourth-down play with 2:08 left in the half. Wilson kept the ball and went right tackle, where he was met by Little and Stroger for no gain.

On their next possession Wilson again led the Cougars down the field to the A&M 26 with seconds left in the half. Wilson called on Omar Perez this time for a 43-yard field goal attempt. He had the distance but was wide to end the half.

The Aggies came firing on the starting blocks the second driving to the Houston 30-line on the strength of some ball-handling by Kubiak and a yard run by Earnest Jackson.

Kubiak read the defense throughout the drive, keeping ball three times on option plays, 12 yards and an important down.

On second-and-six Jackson Kubiak's handoff for 27 yards left guard and was apparently his way for a touchdown when Love stopped him at the Cougar 37.

The drive stalled due to a costly penalty and the Cougar took over.

Two possessions later Aggies were once again on the move, this time from their own 27. Kubiak went around left end for three yards on first down.

Two plays later he cut right behind the defensive end on option play and broke into secondary for a 43-yard run that sent the crowd into a frenzy.

Hardy's kick was good and Ags led 7-0 with 1:35 left in third quarter.

However, the "real" fireworks didn't begin until the fourth quarter.

Following the Aggie touchdown, Houston marched to the A&M 16 where the drive stalled and Perez attempted a 34-yard field goal. This time Greg Williams broke through and cleared the way for a 43-yard field goal that blocked the attempt, much to the crowd's delight.

One play later Kubiak's pass to Don Jones was intercepted by Houston cornerback Butch LaCroix at the Houston 27. Houston turned the ball over three plays later when cornerback Darrell Adams intercepted Wilson's pass, but the Aggies gave it right back on the next play.

Kubiak missed Jackson on handoff and Houston recovered the fumble at their own 20. However, just four plays later defensive tackle Keith Guthrie pounded fullback Allen Polk for a fumble. Free safety Chris Brown recovered for the Aggies with 10:28 left in the game.

Houston came alive about the same time a power failure hit the Texas A&M campus, blacking out the scoreboard with 3:51 left in the game.


Wilson drove his team 80 yards to a score on the strength of his passing, completing five-of-ten for 72 yards and a touchdown with 1:04 remaining. His receiver, however, took a tremendous beating by the Aggie secondary.

Yeoman went for the two-point conversion but fullback David Barrett slipped on the wet turf and the ball fell incomplete, much to the approval of the crowd.

The Houston defense was third best in the nation against the run, yielding an average of 55.7 yards per game and seventh in total defense.


