Funky hits such as "Brick House" and "Too Hot Ta Trot" featured the Commodores dancing across every square inch of the stage in their silvery sequined


Lead singer Lionel Ritchie de-lighted the crowd in announcing he would sing a duet — with the audience — of "Easy."
