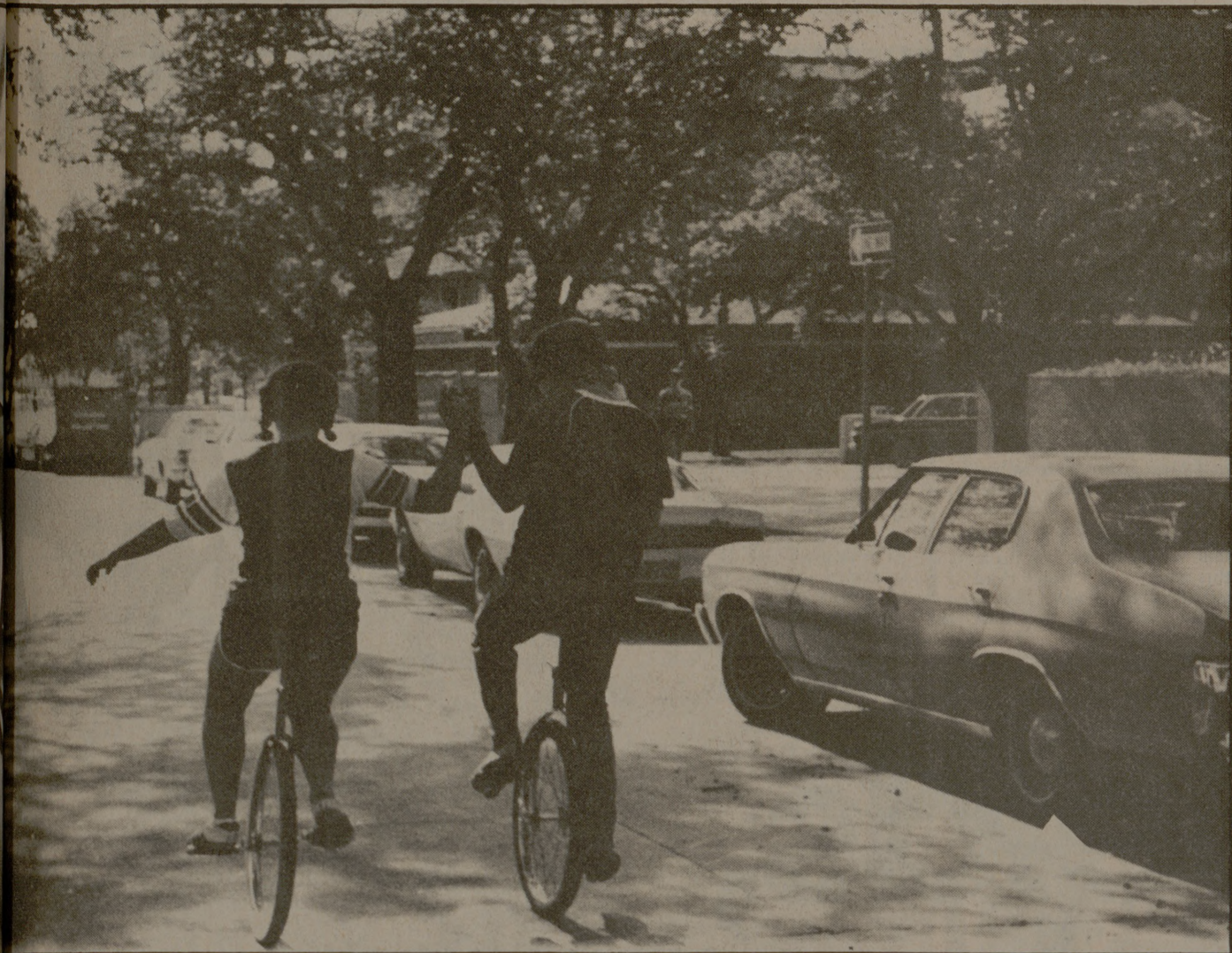

Agents charge chief knew of car bombing

TYLER — Two former Tyler undercover narcotics agents told investigators they had admitted to their police chief one bombed the other's car to collect insurance payments, a Dallas newspaper reported Thursday.

Former agents Creig Matthews and his wife, Kim Ramsey Matthews, told federal investigators of they disclosed their actions to Tyler Police Chief Willie Hardy days after the incident, a source told the Dallas Morning News.

Hardy denied the charge Wednesday.

"I still haven't learned that Creig was responsible," Hardy said. "I recently read in the newspapers something about that, but

that's all I know about it."

The two former agents reportedly said Hardy took no action against them after being informed of the bombing.

A federal grand jury in Tyler is investigating charges that ranking Tyler officials knew of misconduct by the two officers during an 8-month undercover drug probe.

Development plan opposed, commission approves zoning

President opposition of two... dominated the College Station Planning and Zoning Commission meeting Thursday. A final plan for Woodson Village Fifth Incent was approved and a 103-acre rezoning request was tabled. The commission tabled the final plan for the Woodson Village development Sept. 24 with the understanding that a sewer line... would alleviate the water infiltration problems into the lines. The residents have complained increased sewer line problems and said the addition of the proposed 25 lots would substantially... to the problem.

The flooding problems have existed for more than 15 years, Garret Cannon, one of the residents, said. Eileen Kivlesky, another resident, said she wants the lots to be developed comparable to existing... It is best to delay the development until after the infiltration problem is corrected, she said.

The development of 16 or 17... instead of the proposed 25... would accomplish keeping the neighborhood compatible, she said.

"It would be a travesty for this... final plan) to be approved," Cannon said.

However, the final plan was approved 4-1, with two commissioners absent.

Commissioner Wesley Hall... voted against approval because allowing the development proceed will only compound

the sewer problem. The commission tabled the rezoning request for 103 acres on the north side of Southwest Parkway between Dartmouth Avenue and the East Bypass.

Anticipating opposition, the developer, J.W. Wood, met with residents Wednesday to come up with an alternative plan that

would be acceptable.

Commissioner Merl Bailey said the commission needed to look closely at the kind of development the city wants for the south side of Southwest Parkway before a decision for the north side is made.

Behling appointed a subcommittee to meet with the city staff, area residents and developers of

the south side to view the alternative plans.
