Falconer gives birds last chance at life

birds or small animals with falcons or other types of predatory birds. The sport was known to the ancient Chinese, Persians, and Egyptians over 2,000 years ago.

I feel it is my job to use the knowledge I have aquired in falconry to rehabilitate birds," said Karger, who is one of a handful of professional falconers.

He said many of the species of birds he tries to rehabilitate are in danger of becoming extinct,


