

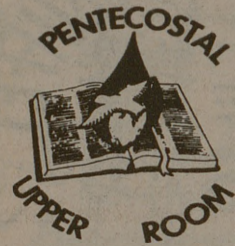

Today is Thursday, Oct. 22, the 295th day of 1981 with 70 to follow.

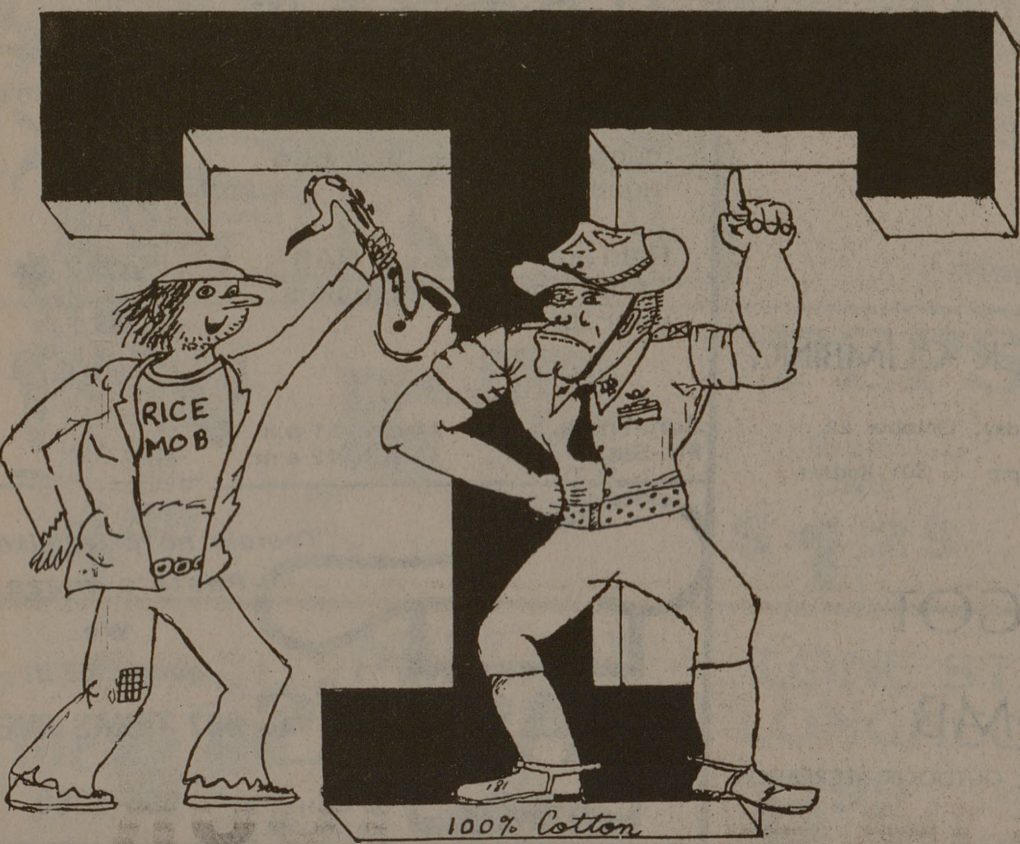
The evening star is Venus. Those born on this date are Libras.

Daughter says Daniels had fight

LIBERTY - The 13-year-old daughter of Vickie Daniel said she heard her mother threaten former Texas House Speaker Price Daniel Jr. with a rifle minutes before he was found dead in his home.

The girl, however, said she did not hear the .22-caliber rifle go off and did not see her mother pull the trigger.

Kimberly Moore, Mrs.

Daniel's daughter from an earlier marriage, testified for more than two hours Wednesday. She was the final state witness in the criminal trial against Mrs. Daniel.

Mrs. Daniel, 34, is charged with murder for the Jan. 19 shooting death of her husband. She claims the shooting was an accident.

Moore said she saw her mother grab a gun from a closet, and tell Daniel to come downstairs from

the attic or else she would shoot. Miss Moore said she asked her mother not to shoot, but was told to go to her room and shut the door.

She obeyed the instructions, but a few minutes later Mrs. Daniel ran into the bedroom with a rag over her mouth and told Moore to stay in the room with her two little brothers. Moore said she ventured out and found her mother kneeling at the foot of the

stairs praying. "I saw the gun and I saw an ambulance and I knew Mama had him," she told defense attorney Jack Zimmermann.

Zimmermann said he was annoyed by Miss Moore's testimony because the young girl had given four sworn statements, one recorded statement and one mentioned seeing or hearing anything more than a fight between Mrs. Daniel and her husband.

Sale of youth pill prohibited by judge

SAN ANTONIO — Youth pills, which promised to make an individual feel up to 30 years younger, will be taken off the market, a state judge says.

The pill, sold by mail order through Edward Merrill's Nutrition Mart, was billed as a concoction to "make you look and feel up to 30 years younger by firming up your skin, smoothing wrinkles and boosting up your energy supply."

Quarter-page newspaper advertisements Austin caught the attention of attorney general's office, which claimed in a court document that the advertisements were misleading.

District Judge Raul Rivera Tuesday he signed a cease-and-desist order that prohibits Merrill from selling the pills.

"It (the order) was not an admission of wrongdoing but a contract between Merrill and the state," Rivera said.
