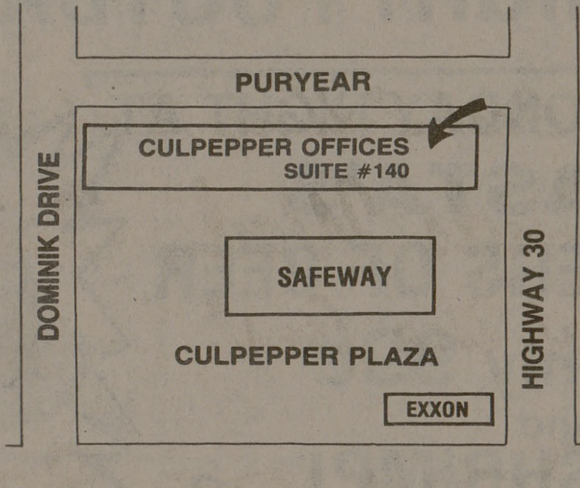

The Ross Volunteers are conducting seminars throughout 1981-82 to improve their service to Texas A&M University.

RV seminars develop leaders

The Ross Volunteers are holding a series of four leadership seminars for junior RVs during 1981-82.

The seminars resulted from a desire of the RVs, who serve as the

honor guard to the Texas governor, to be of greater service to the University and the Corps. RV officers organized the seminars with help from Patricia Barber, student activities advisor.

The first seminar, held Oct. 8, dealt with personal and peer

leadership. Subsequent seminars will be held Oct. 18 on communication and time management, Nov. 8 on stress management and academics, and in the spring, on Texas A&M University involvement and opportunities.

"The cadets' reaction to the first seminar was extremely favorable," Bob Marshall, RV commander, said. "At first, when they found out they had to be cooped up from 5:30 to 10:00 on Sunday night, they weren't very optimistic. But when they got there, they were very pleased and attentive."

Hoby Reed, junior RV, said: "The seminar helped us get insight into the feelings the administrators have and what they expect of us."

"People recognize the fact that you're an RV in the Corps, and they expect more of you. Our responsibility to the Corps is to rise to the expectations that people have of us. We want to make sure the University benefits and not just the Corps."

Marshall said: "The seminars are helping to make the RVs better role models and better sources to draw upon. We have too many good men to not have them actively participating in the University."

The first seminar was divided into three 90-minute segments and began with 15-minute presentations from five Texas A&M officials:

Col. Robert E. Gibson, naval science department; John McCray, management department; Dr. Malon Southerland, assistant to the University president; Dr. Doug Stone, management department; and Maj. James Sanborn, naval science department.

Afterward, cadets divided into 10 groups led by University officials to discuss leadership topics. The same format will be followed for the remaining seminars.

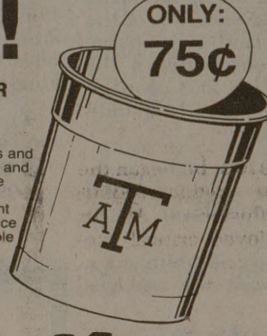
