Animal science major killed in auto accident

An automobile accident that killed Texas A&M student David Wayne Badgett is still being investigated, Chester Smith, patrolman for Bryan Police Department, said.

Badgett was thrown from the 1975 Chevy pickup in which he and two friends were riding, The pickup went into a ditch and rolled several times on FM 2818 around 1 a.m. Sunday, as the men returned home from a dance. Badgett died at 6:47 p.m. from injuries received in

the accident. Curtis William Crittendon of White Oak is in St. Joseph's Hospital with a broken jaw and other facial injuries.

The driver, Larry Andrew Stewart, also a Texas A&M student, was treated and released. According to the police report the men were south bound on FM 2818 when they lost control, and the pickup rolled over several times before coming to a stop in the north-bound lane.


