Houston mayor has word of warning for successor

United Press International HOUSTON — Mayor Jim McConn, who watched voters angrily reject his \$1 million bid for reelection, has a word of warning for his eventual successor.

McConn, a two-term incumbent, failed even to carry his home precinct as voters put City Controller Kathy Whitmire and Harris County Sheriff Jack Heard in a mayoral runoff, expected to be held Nov. 17.

Tuesday's final tally, certified Wednesday by City Council, showed Mrs. Whitmire with 36 percent of the vote, Heard with 24.5 percent, McConn with 13.8 percent, Louis Macey with 13.5 percent and Justice of the Peace Al Green with 9.2 percent. Remaining votes were split among 10 other also-rans.

McConn, whose \$1 million campaign war chest was larger than all others except Heard's, said voter frustration turned the tide in favor of Mrs. Whitmire and

Heard. "They took out their frustration and I was the handiest target," he said. "They're frustrated because because there are not enough city services. They're frustrated because of traffic. And they're frustrated because of potholes."

He also warned the next mayor of Houston.

"The voters think the mayor can solve all the problems. They're looking for a miracle," he said.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Whitmire and Heard began plotting strategy for the runoff.

Mrs. Whitmire, whose grass roots campaign centered on a business-like attitude for City Hall, told supporters she plans to attack Heard with issues and hoped to leave personalities out of the runoff campaign.

"I'll tell you what we have to do in this runoff. We've got to get our opponent out and talk about specifics," she said.

Although she was criticized as a liberal, observed Mrs. Whitmire's reputation for fiscal conservatism while her impressed conservative.

Heard, a law-and-order leader who emphasized leadership in city government, accepted a challenge from Whitmire to debate her runoff.

"We must return Houston's legacy of leadership we had at City Hall. We can't let us take this city back to the position it belongs," he said.

Woman gets fired up after losing car in blaze

United Press International PLANO — Elizabeth Thompson thought "apple pie, the American flag and Chrysler" — until her parked car caught fire in the middle of the night.

And the events that followed the destruction of her 1-month-old Dodge Aries K have convinced the social worker it's time to start looking at foreign cars.

Thompson said Tuesday she finally has accepted a complete settlement from her insurance company, but is still angry at Chrysler Corp. and the treatment it gave her.

"As a social worker I've been fighting for other people for 20 years and now this happens to me

and I'm kicked in the face," she said.

"It's a real shame at what's happened to the American car industry. I always thought apple pie, the American flag and Chrysler — but I don't anymore. I'm now looking at foreign cars."

Thompson said her car, which had been driven only 500 miles, caught fire in her driveway about 1 a.m. Oct. 25 because of faulty wiring.

"It burned to the metal," she said.
