Officials reject Manson parole for fourth time

VACAVILLE, Calif. — Corrections officials again rejected parole for mass murderer Charles Manson, who told them "I ain't got no mind, man" and boasted his heroes included the Ayatollah Khomeini and Adolf Hitler.

Manson, 46, dressed in a T-shirt bearing a small skull and crossed bones for the four-hour hearing Wednesday, told the board: "I'm not ready for parole. I could have saved you all this time."

The three-member Board of Prison Terms unanimously denied parole for the fourth straight year to the inmate, convicted of murdering the bloody murders of actress Sharon Tate and eight others in Los Angeles in 1969.

Pale, slender, long-haired and bearded, Manson jiggled two large white marbles in his hands and interrupted officials frequently during the hearing. Sometimes he appeared confused by the proceedings.

"I ain't got no mind, man — it's gone," Manson said. "I can't understand half of the things you're saying."

He listed the late shah of Iran, Khomeini, Hitler and Benito Mussolini as his heroes, calling them real men.

Manson indicated he expects to spend the rest of his life behind bars. "By the time I get out, I'll parole to space," he said, appearing to smile.

EROTIC DRUGS
has abuse potential

CHICAGO — A substance intensifies sexual pleasure, drives disco dancers to ecstasy, and is used industrially in making plastics — is creating a type of drug-abuse hazard, a biologist warned Thursday.

"Right now, if you get enough of the stuff in your body, you're in a state of ecstasy, you're in a state of euphoria," Purdue University pharmacology professor Roger Maickel said of the drug, butyl nitrite.

Maickel spoke at the annual meeting of the Society for Forensic Toxicologists, a group of scientists who deal with the legal aspects of poisons.

"The big problem is that it's a legal drug, one that I think ought to be of concern, and yet nobody seems to have any jurisdiction over it, or seems to want any jurisdiction over it," he said.

Maickel said users buy the drugs, also used in making perfumes and in various chemical processes, under such names as "Rush," "Climax," "Discorama." They are available at adult book stores, disco bars, or by mail order through magazine ads, he said.

"It has been reported that the compounds are even sprayed over disco floors from ceiling units to rev up dancers," Maickel said.

Although the butyl nitrite is usually inhaled, no deaths from inhalation have been reported, Maickel said, however, deaths have been reported in the last year from swallowing the drug.

"The thing is, the abuse of these compounds has come under scientific scrutiny so recently that it could be other fatalities or other adverse effects of butyl nitrite that simply have not been documented," he said.

He said a study at Purdue found all four butyl nitrites were fatal in reasonably small doses. "The blood literally turns brown," he said. "It can't carry oxygen. What's especially interesting is that the butyl nitrites were fatal no matter how they were administered — orally, injection or just by exposing the mice to the compound in the air."
