## Opportunities in Third World

### Panel to advise students

Representatives from five international corporations will discuss working in foreign countries at a panel discussion in 206 Memorial Student Center at 2 p.m. Thursday.

and provide advice for students considering working in a foreign country.

The panel is sponsored by the Placement Office, the International Students Programs and the Mortar Board.

John Gudelman, assistant director of placement, said working overseas can be an exciting intercultural experience.

"Often opportunities are in Third World countries that can

have the chance to develop into viable entities," he said.

The fields of agriculture, engineering and business can provide lucrative opportunities in Third World countries. Educators are in demand in more economically developed nations, he said.

Gudelman said the career panel will help students become aware of the various policies in different countries, such as visa requirements. Some countries require job applicants to have three to five

years' job experience before they are allowed to enter, he said.

Companies insist that potential employees be competent in their fields and in their understanding of company policy.

"We encourage participation in the career panel because it opens the employment scope for the student," Gudelman said. "There are different policies in different countries. If students are thinking about an overseas career, they need to know the status quo."

### Guide training offered for spring

If you're planning a camping trip or some other outdoor excursion, the MSC Outdoor Recreation Committee may be able to help you have a pleasant and successful outing.

From compasses to tour guides, ORC has what campers need to get started in the right direction. Committee members plan seminars and trips to teach the safe way to have fun in the great outdoors.

ORC is one of the MSC's 19 directorate committees. All programmed events and their planning are open to anyone.

ORC plans seminars and trips in backpacking, canoeing, kayaking, rafting, rockclimbing, caving, and bicycling. The committee also maintains a schedule of trips and a file of camping areas for trip planning.

They also rent a full line of equipment at low prices to Texas A&M students, faculty and staff. This includes various sizes of tents, backpacks, sleeping bags, boats (canoes and kayaks), stoves, cook kits, lanterns, ice chests and many other camping necessities. Equipment rental hours are from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday behind the Grove.

Equipment may be reserved two weeks in advance, and any equipment not reserved will be rented on a first-come, first-served basis. A deposit will be collected at the time of reservation.

Next semester, the ORC will begin an outdoor leadership program to teach prospective tour guides how to plan and supervise trips.

The committee is consulting schools all over the nation to see how other outdoor recreation programs are conducted. The program is to consist of a series of seminars, workshops and trips.

"We want to stress that these people develop judgement," Charlie Walter, advisor for the committee, said. "A person may be fantastic at kayaking, but may not know about first-aid; we will

make sure that all the guides have a well-rounded general knowledge of the outdoors and its possible situations." Safety is the number one aspect of the program, Walter said.

The trips are basically geared towards beginners, but occasionally trips are planned for the experienced camper. Every spring break a beginners' trip is taken to Big Bend National Park for rafting and kayaking on the Rio Grand. More experienced students may want to tackle white-water canoeing in the lower canyons of the Rio Grande.

The Guadalupe River canoe trip has been the most popular in the past and is geared toward beginners, Walter said. During past Christmas breaks, trips have been taken to Rocky Mountain National Park in Colorado for winter camping, snow-shoeing and skiing.

This Thanksgiving, members of the committee will be going to Mexico to scout out possibilities for future trips to the Rio Mactazuma. "There are some great natural resources there that can't be found in the states," Walter said.

Anyone enthusiastic about outdoor recreation is encouraged to attend the events or become a tourguide.

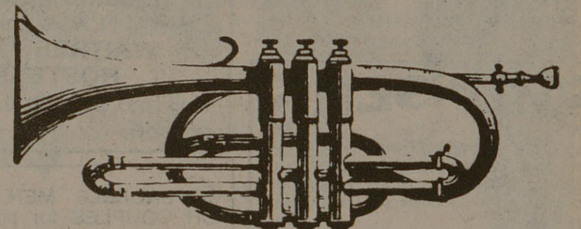
