Libertarian Party expected cast of thousands in 1984

DALLAS — The Libertarian Party hopes to run 1,000 candidates in the 1982 elections and have one of them in the White House by the end of the decade, the party's 1980 presidential candidate says.
Ed Clark, who said he would not be the party's 1984 presidential candidate, said Friday the Libertarians are continuing to build their party.
"Our objective is to be, by the end of the decade, a mass national party as big as the Republicans and Democrats, which will give us a chance not only to elect a lot of people to city councils and legislatures but to Congress, to governor's races, and to the presidency of the United States by the end of the decade," Clark said.
He said the Libertarian Party's goals were to run 1,000 candidates in national elections in 1982, twice

as many Libertarian candidates as were in the 1980 elections. About 100 of these candidates, Clark said, would run for offices in Texas.
Clark said this week's election of three Libertarians to a Houston school board show Libertarians can win. The Libertarian Party supports an increase in individual rights by eliminating big government.
In elections Tuesday, three Libertarians won slots on the Harris County School Board, which operates no schools but provides psychological testing services and cooperative purchasing for 21 school districts in the county.
Texas Libertarian Party Chairwoman Honey S. Lanham, oil

company office worker Bill Pasadena and Jeffrey A. Calvert, were elected to the board.
Clark also said voters are coming increasingly unhappy with the spending record of the administration.
"His increases in spending are so high that never going to be able to the economy," Clark said.
"There's also going to be of faith in Reagan's lip service the free market, (which is) masses of increased federal spending and masses of military spending. We think that will produce a situation for Libertarian major cuts in welfare, major in taxes."

Voters on border cast few ballots

EAGLE PASS — Officials in Maverick County printed 10,000 ballots for Texas statewide elections, but only 180 voters showed up — causing the county clerk to say he has enough scratch pads to last him a decade.
Maverick County voters Tuesday were as sparse as putting greens in Mexican border towns; the county turned out the lowest percentage of voters in the statewide elections. More than 31,000

people live in Maverick County but less than 1.9 percent of 9,010 registered voters bothered to cast ballots.
"I printed 10,000 ballots, 180 were used," County Clerk Enrique Lopez said. "I have scratch pads for the next 10 years."
Eagle Pass is the Maverick County seat, but residents said the town suffers from lack of attention from Austin lawmakers. The city is 85 percent Mexican American and people still close to the city's Mexican city, Piedras Negras, just across the Rio Grande.
"I think we feel more like Mexicans than Texans," Lopez said. "Nobody knew anything about election because there wasn't anything about it in the newspapers."
Victor Perry, a local tax assessor, agreed with Lopez.
"Most of (their) relatives over there," he said. "I'd rather know what's going on there than what's going on here."
