

Metal glove adds texture to hamburger National

WICHITA, Kan. — Customers purchasing hamburger from the commissary at McConnell Air Force Base have been complaining that the mineral content of the meat has been raised considerably by the addition of bits of metal. The hamburger apparently was

contaminated by the ground-up remains of a butcher's metal glove that was lost Oct. 30 and never reported, McConnell public information spokesman Airman Bill Price told the Kansas Information Network Sunday.

The "gloveburger" apparently came about when the glove fell

into the commissary meat grinder and mixed with as much as 800 pounds of hamburger.

Now the meat — and the ground glove — have been spread all over the state, Price said.

He urged everyone who bought hamburger at McConnell after Oct. 30 to return it.

High court accepts legal brief vs. Nixon

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court agreed Monday to let seven members of Congress present arguments that Richard Nixon has no right to claim he cannot be sued for money damages for actions taken as president.

Without comment, the high court accepted legal briefs filed by the members of Congress in a potentially precedent-setting case

that pits Nixon against former Defense Department whistle-blower Ernest Fitzgerald.

The congressmen are asking the justices to note "the threat to the constitutional role of Congress posed by Nixon's contention that an individual has no judicial remedy against former high-ranking executive officials."

Those filing the arguments are Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah; Rep.

Patricia Schroeder, D-Colo.; John Dingell, D-Mich.; Robert Dornan, R-Calif.; Barney Frank, D-Mass.; Albert Gore, D-Tenn.; and Toby Moffett, D-Conn.

The controversy focuses on Nixon's claim of blanket immunity from having to pay damages because he fired Fitzgerald in retaliation for testimony at a congressional hearing on airframe overruns.

"The ability of Congress to out its constitutionally mandated responsibility to enact laws and oversee their execution could be crippled if this court were to hold that there is no judicial remedy against a congressional witness," the lawmakers said.

Nixon was sued by Fitzgerald for \$3.5 million in damages. In June the Supreme Court agreed to delay a trial while it decides crucial constitutional questions on presidential immunity.
