Buried treasure lures man back

CORPUS CHRISTI — The Gulf of Mexico has told him once whatever is buried under her waters should remain there. But geologist J. C. Gautreaux will not heed that warning.

Gautreaux wants a treasure trove of bullion and silver he believes was buried on Padre Island decades ago, and he's planning to mount another effort to unearth it after being beaten back once.

He succeeded in convincing the Nueces County Commissioners Court to issue him a second permit to dig beneath the sand dunes at Padre Balli Park.

Last June, the Freport Texas gas exploration geologist received

permission to dig in a 75-square-foot area on the narrow island strip off the Texas Gulf Coast. But he was forced to abandon his search when pumping equipment failed to keep gulf water from flooding the excavation site.

Gautreaux told the Texas Antiquities Committee the treasure is a large metallic object, but remained secretive.

Gautreaux has a contract with the state — the first of its kind involving a private search for treasure — which entitles him to half of any gold or silver bullion that might be found at the site. It also gives him half the value of any artifacts that might be discovered.

All-male troupe presents ballet with sense of humor

I clapped more at the Les Ballets Trockadero de Monte Carlo concert than I ever have before, not only because I wanted to, but in most cases because it was the only way to get the hammy ballerinas off the stage.

Make no mistake though, these ballerinas knew they were curtain hogs.

Review

Trockadero is an all-male ballet troupe that takes great delight in satirizing traditional dance conventions. Presented by the MSC Opera and Performing Arts Committee Tuesday night, Trockadero managed to poke jokes at classic ballets like "Swan Lake"

by Tchaikovsky, modern ballet by trying to be moral and accurate that have crept into Soviet ballet during the 20th century.

The troupe must know a lot about Russian ballets; all the troupe members have names like Margaret Lowin-Octeyn and rippina Proboskovna.

Sanson Candelaria, alias Sara Boudmyeva, a defector from the Soviet Union, played the queen of the swans in Swan Lake with more eye makeup than Sophia Loren has ever contemplated using.

She jumped, twirled and ed her eyelashes around the with a pompous attitude, demonstrating just how irritating a ballerina can be when lands a sought-after part in classic ballet and it goes to her head.

However, the troupe isn't a bunch of clowns making the ballet. Each member is a dancer and all exhibited their talent through graceful, just smooth twirls and especially difficult footwork on specially signed point shoes.

In their closing performance "Go for Barocco," Trockadero members did a hysterical gag on the female corps that served the main ballerinas on stage throughout their twitching antics, showed remarkable chronization worthy of any ventional ballet company.
