Hog game important, but not end of world

As kickoff between the Arkansas Razorbacks and Texas Aggies nears more and more talk centers around the winner having a clear shot at the Cotton Bowl.

That's not entirely true, however. The 1981 Southwest Conference race is one full of surprises. Just ask Arkansas' Lou Holtz. The Razorbacks traveled to Fort Worth earlier this year to play TCU and returned to Fayetteville with a 28-24 loss. Then, just one week later he humiliated the Texas Longhorns 42-11 on TV.

The point is anything can happen. Anybody can beat anybody on a given day.

Despite what may happen Saturday the season is not over for either team. While the winner does have a good shot at the Cotton Bowl, the loser has a good chance at another bowl. That, of course, hinges on the assumption that both teams play well the remainder of the season, or at least until Nov. 21 when bowl bids will be handed out.

Texas A&M travels to TCU next week then returns to College Station for a Thanksgiving matchup with Texas. Arkansas, meanwhile, closes out its season at home against SMU next week.

Which is at stake Saturday when the Aggs and Hogs line up. Both teams have suffered two league losses and the loser will, in all likelihood, be out of the race. Both Tom Wilson and Lou Holtz know the down and situation and what each team has to do. The result of their work makes for one of the nation's best games of the year.

"We're very pleased to be in the position we are in," Wilson said. "We're happy to still be in the race. I really enjoy playing at Texas A&M," placekicker Bruce Lohay said. "Their fans are really good. They're like ours are. I think the entire team enjoys playing there."
