Texas' 10-year-old case lingers on

Ruling supports prison reform order

United Press International HUNTSVILLE — A ruling by the Justice Department supporting reform of Texas' overcrowded penal system came as no surprise to officials of the Texas Department of Corrections.

"It's not proper to make a definitive comment (on the action) until we can have attorneys review the document," TDC spokesman Rick Hartley said Tuesday. "But I don't think the position of the Justice Department comes as a sur-prise. Their position was clear during the trial and the appellate

The state is appealing the ruling before the 5th Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans and negotiations are continuing to settle some issues. Oral arguments in the appeal are scheduled for December.
