

Anti-submarine plane crashes in Mediterranean

United Press International JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — An anti-submarine plane from the aircraft carrier USS Nimitz crashed in the Mediterranean Sea during routine flight exercises Tuesday, killing all four Navy crewmen aboard.

The plane was attached to Air Anti-Submarine Squadron 24 based at Cecil Field Naval Air Station in Jacksonville.

Two rescue helicopters were dispatched immediately to the crash site, but no survivors were visible in the water.

Ensign Debbie Martin said the plane was about a mile from the USS Nimitz when it went down 70 miles northwest of Sicily. The Nimitz has been deployed in the Mediterranean since late August.

Lt. Cmdr. Tom Connor, public affairs officer in Norfolk, Va., for the Atlantic Fleet's Naval Air Force, said the cause of the crash was under investigation.

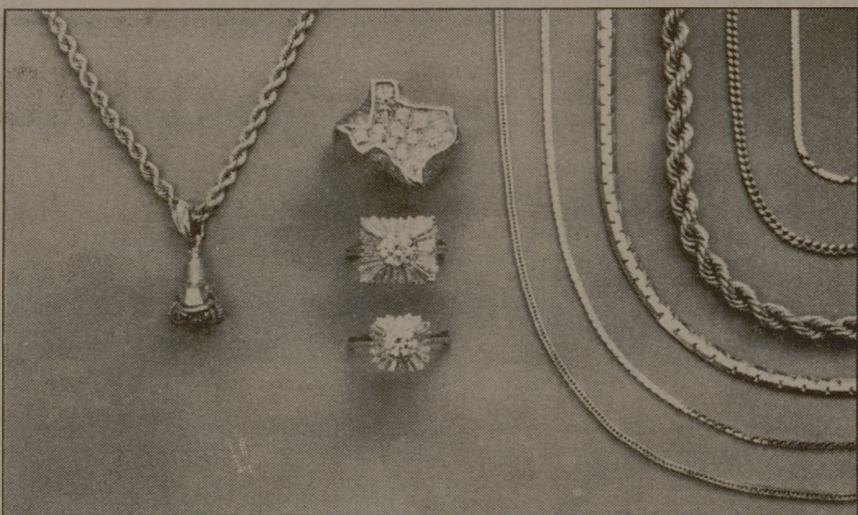

Congress supports Reagan's arms plan

United Press International President Reagan's call for mutual U.S.-Soviet arms reductions drew bipartisan support Wednesday in Congress, where members said his global address reassures Western Europe but puts the Soviet Union on the spot.

Sen. Jake Garn, R-Utah, said: "This is an opportunity for the Soviets to put up or shut up."

Senate Republican leader Howard Baker called Reagan's speech historic, saying: "I believe it will have a profound effect on the foreign policy not only of the United States but of the world."

Senate Armed Services Committee Chairman John Tower, R-Texas, said Reagan's proposal will serve to convince the Western Europeans of the United States' sincerity in its quest for arms reduction. Tower said the proposal should help eliminate the threat posed to Western Europe by the enormous buildup of Soviet intermediate-range missiles.

Tower said Reagan's message will have a positive effect on the United States' relationships with Western allies.

Tower met Tuesday with NATO Secretary General Joseph Luns, who he said had been told of Reagan's message and "was very pleased with the message and thought it was an enormously constructive step."

House Democratic leader Jim Wright of Texas called Reagan's proposal "a useful and bold initiative, which I think all of us in the House, Democrat and Republican alike, do and should support."

Wright urged the Soviets to act favorably on the peace initiative, which could reduce to zero the number of missiles in Europe.

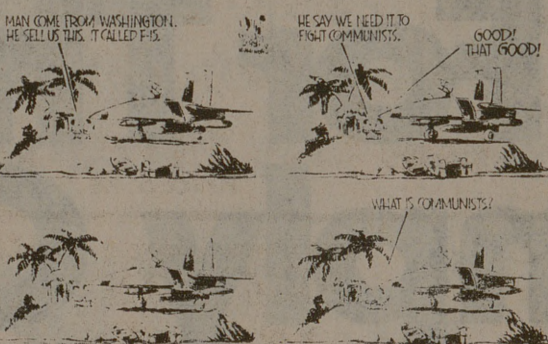
Sen. Gary Hart, D-Colo., said Reagan took a "bold and far-reaching arms control position."
