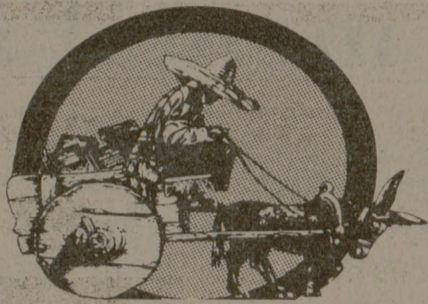

## Detectives have solved cookie caper

SAN FRANCISCO — San Mateo County detectives have cracked what they call a cookie espionage caper.

The officers said Monday they arrested James D. Sims Jr., 23, a cook, and Angela D. Robertson, 30, a waitress, during the weekend at the Airport Hilton on charges of extortion, possession of stolen property and selling trade secrets.

The two California residents had tried to sell 12 secret recipes from Mother's cookies to Pepperidge Farms for \$20,000, the detectives said. A third suspect, a former Mother's employee, was sought by deputies.

Detective Bill Buchalter said in September a letter was sent to the research division of Pepperidge Farms in Connecticut offering to sell the recipes. A sample recipe, for Mother's Soft Oatmeal Cookies, was enclosed.

## Child abuse up as welfare cut

A mother told Pennsylvania welfare officials she was about to become a child abuser. Faced with losing her benefits because of President Reagan's budget cuts, she feared she would take it out on her 4-year-old child.

Joseph Spear of the Pennsylvania Welfare Department said the woman's case may soon become typical.

He said: "She said, 'My back is to the wall. I'm not an abuser but this could be the thing that pushes me over the brink.'"

In a year when child abuse has increased in most states, some welfare officials blame Reagan's budget cuts for creating more intra-family stress that leads to abuse. Others do not go so far, tracing the increase only as far as general economic problems or more frequent reporting of abuse. But with less money in welfare households, parents will be under more stress and more likely to take out their frustrations on their children.

"There is a big increase largely because parents are more and more unable to provide for their children," said Julia Douglas, assistant director of Child and Youth Protective Services in Philadelphia. "The stresses of our times have been exacerbated by Reaganomics and the least capable person of getting out of the way is the child."

Rose Orsborn, program director for the Texas Child Welfare Department, said: "It's not just low-income families. It's middle-

income families too — families that don't have the resources to seek treatment or counseling. With cutbacks, those resources become less and less. When we have limited resources, your rate of success is not very high."

Reagan's welfare cutbacks were enacted less than two months ago and their full effect is not yet known, but child welfare officials fear the consequences not only for welfare families but for their staffs. Welfare workers already complain about heavy case loads but they will not be able to serve many families because the budget cuts will force staff reductions. "One thing it has forced us to do is put priorities on abuse cases we look at," Bill Wagner of the Texas Department of Human Resources said. "With fewer people we are forced into making decisions as to whether this child is in immediate danger of being abused or maybe killed or is this child just going to be neglected. God help us that the decisions we make are right."

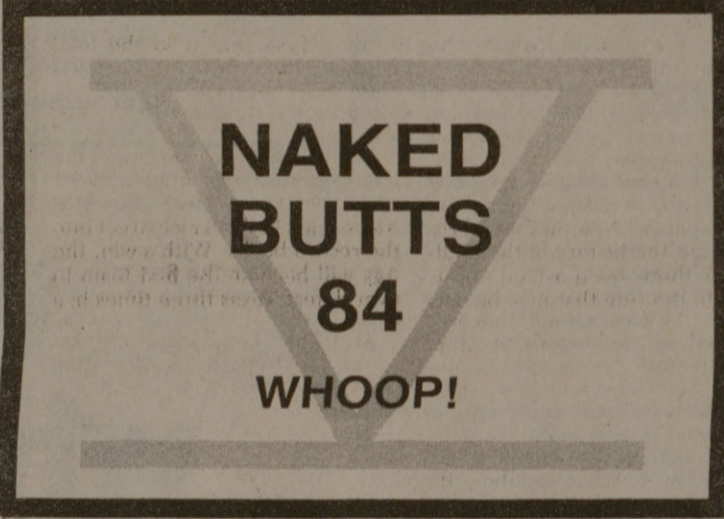

## 125 liquor stores sue Uncle Sam

SAN ANTONIO — A group representing 125 liquor stores has filed suit against the Army and Air Force, claiming on-base liquor stores at Fort Sam Houston, Randolph and Lackland Air Force bases violate military regulations and threaten private liquor-store owners' business.

The San Antonio Package Stores Association and several individual plaintiffs filed the federal suit Monday.

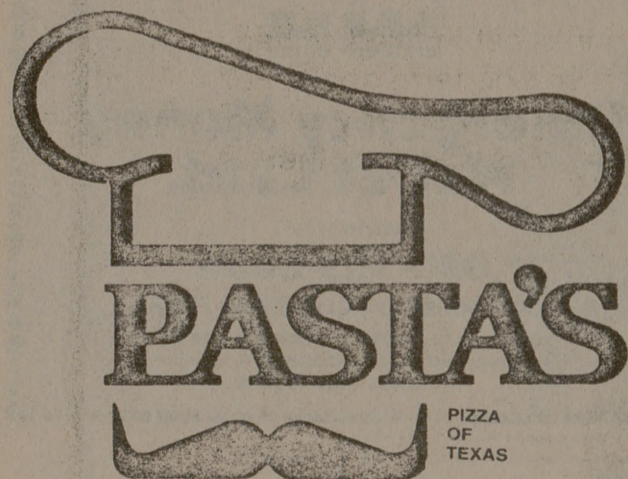
Attorney Gerald Goldstein said he filed the suit on behalf of private liquor store owners because the military had used fraudulent, deceitful and coercive methods to open the on-base stores.

"The military's unique relation-

ship with many persons persuaded them (those persons) change their initial opposition to that amounts to coercion," Goldstein said at a news conference.

"The military unfairly used its posture as the community's largest employer and consumer to the detriment of legitimate businessmen in the private sector," Goldstein said.

The suit was prompted by a package store near Lackland Air Force Base for 19 years but were forced to shut down the store when it suffered an 80 percent drop in business after Lackland opened its own package outlet last year, Goldstein said.

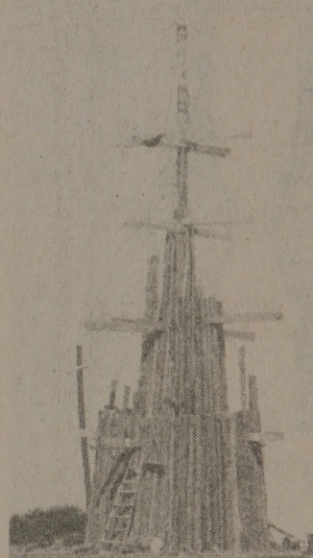
