HL&P spokesman Don Beeth said Monday the Quadrex report was made available to the NRC one week after it was received and was sent to the NRC at its request about one month ago. He said the report's findings were not as dis-

astrous as opponents claimed. "Serious, yes," Beeth said. "Catastrophic, no."

The report said Brown & Root, The group claimed Monday HL&P withheld from the NRC damaging details of a consultant's report that outlined serious design faws in the nuclear plant.

The group claimed Monday of other nuclear plants without checking to see whether the engineering meshed with that of the South Texas project.


