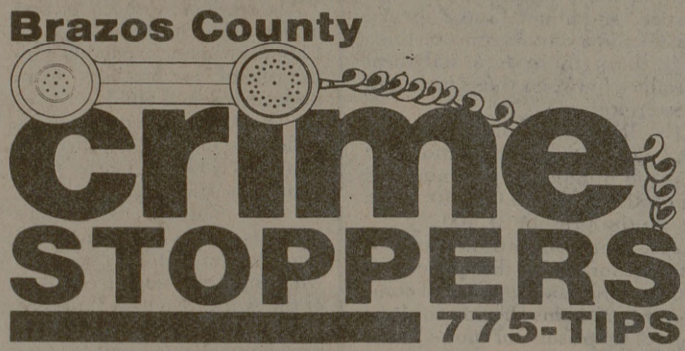

Crime of the Week  
to reenact local rape

The Nov. 1 rape of a high school student in an off-campus parking lot will be featured on the first episode of the Week TV program tonight.  
The program will air during the 10 p.m. news on Channel 3, re-creating the aggravated rape. At 3:44 that morning, a 17-year-old out-of-town high school student parked her truck in front of the Sevilla Apartments, Anderson St.  
As she was getting out of the truck, a man appeared and pushed her down on the truck's floor-pan. With a knife against her throat, the man raped her, during which he continuously repeated, "Why did you do this to me?"  
Police are looking for a 20-year-old white male for questioning in connection with the incident. Detective Charles Owen, of the Brazos County Sheriff's Department, said Monday. The man, who is described as being 6 feet tall, of medium build and well-tanned, wearing blue jeans, a white shirt and a white handkerchief in the lower part of his face at the time of the rape.



Anyone who has information about the rape should call Brazos County Crime Stoppers at 775-TIPS. The group, which sponsors the Crime of the Week show, will pay \$1,000 this week for information leading to an arrest and indictment in the case.  
The group says callers need not identify themselves and it guarantees that all information received will be handled confidentially. Crime Stoppers also will pay up to

\$1,000 for information that leads to an arrest and indictment in any unsolved felony case.  
Every Tuesday, Owen said, the Crime of the Week program will focus on an unsolved crime in the local area. The show will air during Channel 3's 6 p.m. and 10 p.m. news and its 6:30 a.m. news on Wednesdays. The Battalion will print an account of each week's program.

Brochures and information on university academic travel/study programs, including trips to Italy, Scotland, England, France, Germany and Spain, will be available at the seminar.

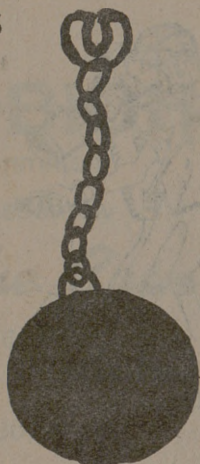
