National Oil storage rush claimed to have wasted millions

United Press International DALLAS — The federal government's rush to stockpile oil in underground salt domes in Texas and Louisiana may have wasted \$500 million, senior officials connected with the energy project say.

Officials at the Department of Energy's Strategic Petroleum Reserve have acknowledged that poor planning, improper contracting and spending since the inception of DOE's Strategic Petroleum Reserve in 1977 led to the problems.

A series of audits and studies by two federal agencies revealed more than \$500 million was lost through waste and mismanagement. But SPR officials said the program has been improved by "99.5 percent" since the time of

the studies, conducted during the Carter administration. The 1973 Arab oil embargo made government officials place higher priority on the oil storage project than any federal emergency program since the Berlin airlift, said Dewayne Gray, executive director of the SPR office in New Orleans. Another embargo also was being threatened in 1977.

A recent study by the U.S. General Accounting Office also indicated the decision to use a management team of career government employees, rather than people connected with the energy industry, led to problems. "There is not anybody in Washington at any level who knows as much about the oil and gas business as do people in Louisiana, Texas and Oklahoma, former Louisiana Gov. Edwin Edwards said.

"Fast-tracking" also led to a waste, said Harry Jones, deputy assistant secretary of energy in the SPR. Jones is a new manager with the DOE with 22 years of experience in the petroleum business.

Through September of this year, the agency pumped \$2.8 billion barrels of oil into the salt domes. The Reagan administration has stockpiled an additional 217 million barrels. Other problems with the SPR include: —The possibility of excessive shipping charges assessed by private oil firms on the quality of replacement crude delivered to the SPR by those companies. —The spending of \$13 million in "unnecessary and avoidable costs" in the construction of pipelines.

—The "excessive" expenditure of at least \$7.1 million because SPR officials acquired drilling rigs from a single contractor who used "inadequate and often defective drill rigs. —The failure of DOE to enforce delivery contracts aggressively when oil prices increased dramatically and oil had to be replaced over \$9 extra per barrel — a \$1 million loss for the taxpayers. —The government's lack of accurate way of measuring, storing, which resulted in the applicable loss of tens of millions of gallons of oil.

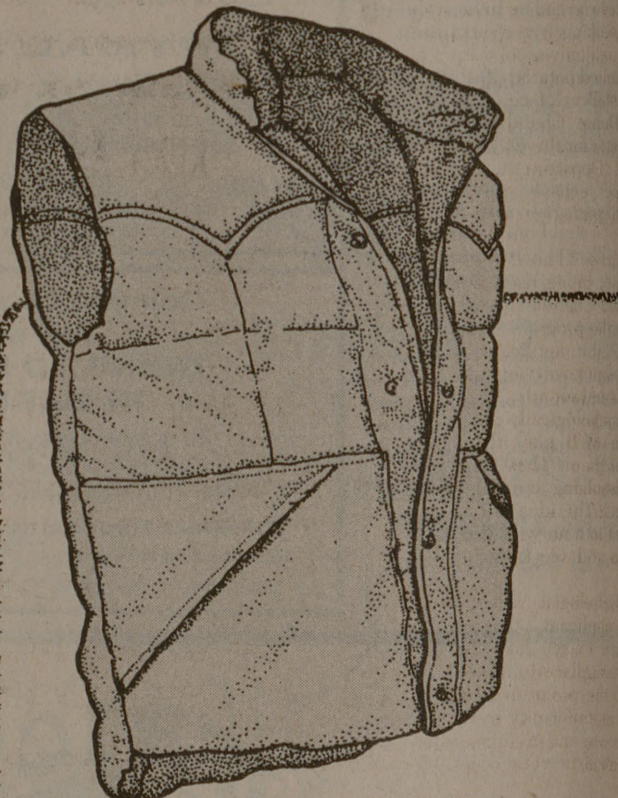
