State Insurance man says arsonists rarely convicted

DALLAS — Arson will account for 1,000 deaths and 10,000 injuries next year, an insurance spokesman says, yet fewer than 2 percent of arson investigations end in convictions.
Legislators, insurance company representatives and fire department officials are meeting in Dallas at the National Legislative Conference on Arson to consider methods of improving communication and of improving prosecution of arsonists. The conference opened Wednesday.
"Arson is almost a no-risk proposition," Barry Walker, an Insurance Information Institute spokesman, said. "To convict someone of criminal arson, you practically have to put the match in the guy's hand."
Walker said only 16 percent of the nearly 150,000 arson-related fires in 1980 led to arrests.
One measure now taken in 47 states which has improved arson investigation is a law that protects insurance companies from liability if they share policy-holder information with fire and law enforcement investigators.
The law also requires insurance companies to notify authorities of suspicious fire losses.
Walker said that because of a slumping economy there will be an increase in the number of fires resulting from arson.
"It's worse when economies are more difficult, because first, people are trying to get out on their insurance and second, people are trying to get out of mortgage by having the insurance pay it off."
The National Fire Prevention Association, an organization of firefighters and people interested in fire control, estimate that in 1980, the group put property from those fires at \$1.7 billion.
But Walker said those figures do not measure the huge monetary losses due to arson.
"There is no estimate," he said, "of the economic damage being that's burned, there's only going to be people out of work."
Also, there's no estimate of taxes that are lost from arson. This has been one of New York City's big problems. Other companies that are burned out do not rebuild, they just move. An area with a history of arson is an area of economic decline.

Dallas to issue new warrants

DALLAS — Thousands of outstanding misdemeanor arrest warrants that a federal judge ruled unconstitutional will be reissued, Dallas County district attorney Henry Wade said.
U.S. District Judge Patrick E. Higginbotham ruled Monday the procedure of routinely issuing 800 misdemeanor arrest warrants each week on information received from the district attorney's office is unconstitutional.
Up to 50,000 cases may be affected by the ruling.
Higginbotham called the method a mindless flow of government paper that caused thousands of people to be arrested illegally.
The district attorney said although some older warrants will be dismissed, most of the affected by Higginbotham's ruling will be rewritten and submitted as misdemeanor court judges reissuing by the end of the year.
Wade said he is confident a system requiring municipal magistrates to review requests warrants will guard against similar problems in the future.
In his ruling this week, Judge said both the county and new methods of issuing warrants for minor thefts, drug session and other misdemeanors were unconstitutional because they did not require a judge or justice of the peace to probable cause for the arrest before the warrants were issued.
However, attorneys for county officials said they would produce evidence next week to show changes in warrant procedure during the past few months corrected the problem by requiring a municipal judge or justice of the peace to review each application for a warrant.
