## Iran hotel owner wants bill paid

**FORT WORTH** — A federal judge will decide whether Bell Helicopter International must pay a \$2.7 million dollar Iranian hotel bill.

Mehdi Abdoh claims that Bell should pay him \$2.7 million because the company failed to carry out contracts reserving suites in his Beau Sauvage Hotel in Isfahan, Iran, through this year.

The contracts specify that the agreements become void if a war should destroy or seriously damage the hotel, but they do not mention revolution or international strife that would force the firm to withdraw its personnel.

Abdoh, who said he fled his homeland during the political turbulence, lists New York as his home.

Bell attorneys said the contracts were negotiated in Iran in 1976 and 1978 and called for payment in Iranian currency. As a result, there is a question whether U.S. courts have jurisdiction to enforce the contracts if they are considered valid.

Abdoh said he cannot obtain a hearing in Iranian courts.

## Psychologist sponsors contest to unload her \$84,000 home

**FREDERICKSBURG** — A local psychologist says she is sponsoring an essay contest that will provide the winner with an \$84,000 country home complete with barn, guest house and livestock pens.

Dr. Harriet Marshburn said the person who writes the best essay on "Why I Want to Own My Own Home" in 100 words or fewer will receive her seven-acre spread just south of Fredericksburg.

The psychologist, who said she wants to relocate to a larger city, failed to attract any buyers on the conventional market and decided to sponsor the contest last week.

The winner will be announced March 21.

"I am not looking for sympathy," she said. "All I want to do is unload the house."

Marshburn hopes to attract at least 3,000 entrants, assuring her of \$150,000. Entry in the contest costs \$50.
