PAWTUCKET, R.I. — Exercise guru Richard Simmons mailed his sneakers, Brooke Shields slipped off her powder blue Italian flats and actor Ed Asner sent a pair of musty old boots worn in his television role as a gruff newspaper editor.

The Pawtucket Public Library will sell its celebrity footwear collection, now numbering 40 pairs, in a January benefit auction.

Last July, library community services coordinator Lee Eaton and co-workers pored through magazines, record jackets and "Who's Who" and began typing letters to movie, TV and sports stars.

"I know you've been asked for everything under the sun ..." Eaton's 300 letters began.

"I'm thrilled to get this many," Eaton said Wednesday.

Screen star John Travolta sent soft leather loafers. Diminutive actress Sally Struthers mailed in a pair of silver disco-style sandals, elevated by 2-inch heels.

Asner sent in ankle-high boots

just like the kind he wears on (in the series "Lou Grant") Eaton said. "They look like they're mildewed or something."

Charlton Heston waited until he wore out a pair of size 12 sneakers before mailing them. Eaton plans to brighten up the sneakers with a Christmas bow.

However, Eaton got more than shoes — a few stars include bonuses with the shipment of their shoes.

Shields included an autographed photo, signed "hugs & kisses." Comedian Marty Ingels now an agent, sent along a photo of his legs bare from the knee down. His wife, actress Shirley Jones, sent gold sandals.

Mickey Rooney declined the quest, writing that his feet are small all his shoes are custom made. He said he wears them until they have to be thrown out.

"Send a hat for the top of a tree," a persistent Eaton wrote back.

"I don't think I own one," Rooney replied.

WHITE BEAR LAKE, Minn. — Most people outgrow their belief in Santa Claus before they hit their teens. But Craig Bartlett and his family know the spirit of St. Nick is alive and well in the form of a Minnesota car dealer.

The car dealer watched Bartlett and his two young children struggling through the snow toward his lot and told a startled salesman to give Bartlett a car.

Bartlett, 30, of Richfield, and his children had set out last Friday in search of a \$100 car advertised by Polar Chevrolet, a White Bear Lake car dealer.

He knew the family had to have something to replace his 1967 Chevrolet, which was badly damaged a month ago in an accident.

But the car overheated and stalled on Highway 61 more than a mile from the dealer. So Bartlett bundled up his children in blankets and started walking.

Matthew, 2, and Michele, 5, struggled along the roadway with their father until they finally reached what Bartlett thought was Polar Chevrolet but turned out to be White Bear Lincoln Mercury.

"I asked them if they had a \$100 car and they said they didn't," Bartlett said. But the salesman

suggested they look around. "They showed me a Pinto and after looking it over, I said, 'This is it for \$100.'"

Salesman Bill McKnight wanted to get the title papers from Lee, 35, the dealership owner. When McKnight returned, he asked Bartlett if he would sell for \$6.50.

"I thought it was \$100," Bartlett replied. McKnight told him, "I believe it or not, the owner said sell it for \$1. The \$5.50 is for transferring the title."

The white, nearly rust-free Pinto was the first car he had ever given away in his 15 years in business, McKnight said.

McKnight said when he saw Lee saw Bartlett's kids wrapped in blankets walking down the highway, Lee said "give him a car."

"We sold it for \$1 to make the legal," McKnight said. "He told them to save the rest of the money for the kids for Christmas."

Bartlett, who had to show a bill of sale in his wife to prove the transaction, is still incredulous over his luck.

"Even the snow (tire) tread on it, the radio works, everything works! They even towed my car to their lot."

HOUSTON — A teen-age mother who abandoned her one-hour-old daughter has been granted conditional custody of the infant by a family court judge.

Family District Judge Robert Baum Wednesday accepted the Harris County Welfare Department's recommendation and returned the infant to the mother who had abandoned her Nov. 21. A final custody hearing was set for Feb. 2.

Lawyer Aldrinette Chapital, who represented the mother, said the decision marked "a happy return for the child."

Baum ordered the 16-year-old mother to return to Dallas with her child where she will learn to care for the baby from her mother.

The baby, nicknamed "Doe" by authorities, was wrapped in a sheet on a doorman in near freezing weather. The doorman called an ambulance for the baby girl.

Chapital said welfare authorities decided the case was not one of abuse and that the mother had been "scared enough" by the incident and subsequent news coverage not to repeat her action. Chapital declined to give a reason for the abandonment and said the mother acted out of fear.

The baby has been in custody of the welfare department since it was found.
