

Congressmen deny charges of censoring television ads

WASHINGTON — Three

rominent Democratic congressnen have denied charges that hey conspired to censor controversial anti-liberal television commercials by the National Conservative Political Action Com-

Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., and House Democratic eader Jim Wright of Texas dismissed the accusations, leveled by NCPAC chairman Terry Dolan, as grandstanding and absolutely unounded. And Sen. Daniel Moyninan, D-N.Y., said Tuesday that broadcasters are going by the First Amendment, not by what he tells

Dolan told a news conference had refused to carry NCPAC commercials attacking the liberal voting records of congressmen on the organization's hit list. Some of the members conspired with the stations — or pressured them — into not carrying the ads, he said.

Wright denied the charges: "This organization is very careless country have declined their mate-

Moynihan said his lawyers sent a memorandum of law to New York broadcasters last summer advising them "stations are under no ... obligation to sell (ads) to groups like NCPAC" and that if they do, libel laws would not pro-

"We did it in the most open possible way," Moynihan said. "I did not give any television station the right to do what they do. The First Amendment does and the Federal Communications Commission does. I haven't called anybody. A large proportion of staons that were requested to run NCPAC ads refused to do so. You'll have to ask them why

But Dolan said the television stations' refusal to air the advertisements is a "serious violation. of (the) fundamental right of free speech and expression as guaranteed by the First, the Fifth and 14th Amendments.


