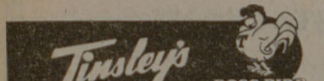

Lombardi Award goes to UT tackle

HOUSTON—All-America de-
fensive tackle Kenneth Sims,
accepting the prestigious Lom-
bardi Award Thursday night, pas-
sed the credit on to his coaches
and his mother, and said he'd just
done what he was supposed to do
all season.
Sims, his leg in a cast because of
torn ligaments, had already de-
scribed himself as the nation's No.
1 defensive lineman, so he was
expected to win the prestigious
award.
But in his acceptance speech,
Sims singled out his mentors, Uni-
versity of Texas coach Fred Akers
and assistant coach Mike Parker.
"Without their help I would
have been just another football
player," he said. "I was a good man
before I came (to Texas), but since
I got there I've gotten even bet-
ter," he said.
His mother, who was in the
audience, he described as "my
first coach" and "one lady who I
don't think I will ever be able to
repay."
Asked what inspired his perfor-
mance on the field, he said:
"I've done the things any lineman
wanted to do."
"It didn't take us long to see
Kenneth had the necessary skills
The only question that remained
was he going to do something
with it, and it didn't take long to
find out he would."
Sims said the award would
serve in future years to bring
back great memories and repre-
sent some great achievements,
and let me know the work did go
to waste.
Sims said the award for college
football's top lineman, said to be
awarded was as "symbolic to me
the Heisman is to a running back."
Looking to the New Year (the
game with Alabama, Sims said,
we win the Cotton Bowl, we get
everything we planned to get
this year."
Asked earlier what winning the
award would do for his profes-
sion football career, Sims said:
"Much really. Not a great deal."
The defensive tackle won the
award over Arkansas defense
end Billy Ray Smith, Penn Sta.
offensive guard Sean Farrell and
Notre Dame middle linebacker
Bob Cramle.
Smith, the only junior in con-
tention for 12th annual Lombardi
Award, had said he expected to
be the winner. "I think his
cord speaks for itself."
No junior has ever won the trophy,
a stylized 40-pound black
granite.

San Diego shortstop deals Cards proposal for royal flush salary

HOLLYWOOD, Fla.— Wait until Dave Winfield hears THIS.
Shortstop Ozzie Smith of the San Diego Padres, who will be traded
to the St. Louis Cardinals for shortstop Garry Templeton as soon
as contingencies can be worked out in their contracts, sees no reason why
he can't become the highest paid player in baseball.
The flashy Smith, a .222 hitter but recognized by some veteran
members of baseball as one of the best fielding shortstops ever, wants
25-year contract starting at \$1.3 million per year with general increase
of 10 percent each year. That would give the 26-year-old shortstop
salary of \$3.25 million a year at the age of 52 and a contract worth more
than \$30 million.
Winfield, a former teammate of Smith's at the San Diego Padres, is baseball's
highest paid player with a 10-year, \$23 million contract with the New
York Yankees.
The cornerstone of the trade that will put the two All-Star shortstops
in different uniforms next season was laid Thursday night at
baseball meetings when the Cardinals sent outfielder Sixto Lezcano
to the Padres for pitcher Steve Mura. A "player to be named later"
each team was specified as part of the deal and the trade could involve
six players or even more.
"There are a lot of things involved here," said Cardinals general
manager Whitey Herzog. "It might take a week, it might take a month,
it might take two months. This will be a bigger trade than anything
I made last December. It will be more important to the Cardinals and
more important to the San Diego Padres."

Alabama linebacker may miss Cotton after arrest

TUSCALOOSA, Ala.— All-Southeastern Conference linebacker
Thomas Boyd, who was suspended by Alabama Coach Bear Bryant for
a curfew violation during the regular season, may miss the Cotton
Bowl because of a marijuana possession charge.
Boyd was released on \$500 bond Thursday night after being booked
on a felony drug charge at the Tuscaloosa County Jail.
The arrest stemmed from a Wednesday night incident in which
police said they stopped Boyd after he almost caused a traffic accident
near the Alabama campus. Police noticed his car had an expired license
tag.
Officers said they found marijuana in Boyd's car.
"After stopping the automobile, the officers smelled a strong odor
what appeared to be marijuana," Capt. Billy Tinsley said. "The officers
found a roach clip (a marijuana cigarette holder) and a small clear
purse with a plastic bag, which appeared to have marijuana in it."
"There was also a capsule in the glove compartment," he said.
Boyd, according to the police report, told the officers the capsule
was an inflammation pill that football players take when they are
injured.
Sophomore running back Linnie Patrick was a passenger in the car
but was not charged.
Alabama officials said neither Boyd or Patrick participated in the
team's practice Thursday. They said Coach Bear Bryant would proba-
bly make a statement today concerning the incident.
