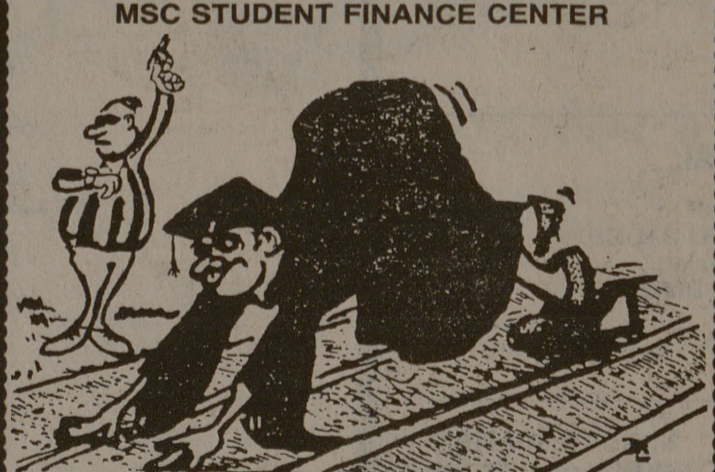

# Americans pray for Polish people

Polish Americans — some with tears streaming down their faces — marched in Chicago and New York City, burning a Soviet flag and singing the Polish anthem to protest the crackdown in their homeland. Thousands more, including for the lives of their ones, said special Monday.

"I have to tell you, I am shaking — I can almost not said Jan Krason, a Denver geologist who emigrated from Poland years ago and who spent an amazing day thinking about his brothers and four sisters who long to the Solidarity labor union. Many Polish Americans are anxious to speak with relatives in communications were blocked by the Polish government.

"We can only pray," said Chicago Alderman Roman Puzos, perhaps the best known leader of the largest Polish community side Warsaw with an estimated 600,000 Poles.

Solidarity leader Lech Walesa's first cousin, Walter Broder, who lives in Passaic, N.J., on the day riveted to his radio television for reports on his native. Walesa was reportedly in for talks with the government. About 350 demonstrators chanted Sunday outside the consulate in Chicago and cheerfully as some demonstrated by burning a Soviet flag they called "symbol of Russian oppression."

Many cried as they sang Polish national anthem. They were no arrests.

"People are worried about relatives and friends abroad here to show we are with them. We have one identity, it shows here," said Roman Kraski, an editor of the Polish Political Quarterly magazine, which organized the weekly rally.

Another protest was planned in Chicago Monday.

Roman Catholic Bishop L. Abramowicz of the Polish Five Holy Martyrs Church in Chicago's South Side, said he was being said for an end to the strike.

"We hope this will not turn bloodshed," he said.

In New York, more than 100 protesters waving Polish flags carrying signs with the Solidarity union emblem marched in a block-long demonstration in the Polish consulate in Manhattan.

Police sealed off the block of the consulate and at one point group lunged towards police officers who removed a white banner with the word "Solidarity" Polish for Solidarity — printed red from the consulate building.

But the group retreated and police handed the long banner back to several protesters there were no reported arrests.

"Russia has everything to do with this," said Irene Laska, leader of the student riots at saw University in Poland who was jailed in 1968 on several occasions for dissident activities.

Alice Cerwinski, who came to the United States from Poland years ago, marched with her year-old son and burst into tears when she told of friends and relatives still in Poland that were involved in the Solidarity movement.

"It's terrible," she said.

In the Greenpoint section of Brooklyn, a mostly Polish neighborhood, the Rev. John H. said Sunday services at the National Catholic Church of Resurrection focused on the morning, he said. "It was an emotional. Many of the congregation members broke down."
