# Rapp, Aggie Ladies lose to Owls, 59-47

Coach Cheri Rapp of the Texas A&M women's basketball team has tried nearly every combination available to her, but none seem to bring success. However, even with her squad's 4-10 record, the Aggie Ladies' coach isn't giving up.  
Texas A&M lost its 10th game of the last 11 Tuesday night, dropping a 59-47 decision to Rice University in G. Rollie White Coliseum. The Owls lifted their record to 13-1, while after winning their first three games of the year, the Aggie Ladies fell to 4-10. The one win since the season-opening streak came in the Dallas Classic Dec. 19, when Texas A&M defeated McNeese State 76-71.  
Throughout the first half of the season, Rapp has alternated her starting lineups. She's platooned her players so much that only two — guard Kelley Sullivan and forward Lynette Joiner — are averaging over 20 minutes of playing time each game. She's tried desperately to find a proper balance of height, quickness and scoring ability among her 12-player roster.  
After the loss to the Owls, Rapp said she plans to keep looking for a key ingredient that will bring her team victories.  
"We'll just have to pick up the pace and keep trying and searching. It'd be a lot better if we

were a lot more consistent."  
Rapp, whose team played on an even basis with the Owls during the first half and went into the locker room at halftime tied at 32, started the game with a lineup of 5-6 guard Romy Gandy, 5-8 guard Sullivan, 6-1 post Cathy Foreman, 5-11 forward Kelly Krauskopf and 5-9 forward Joiner. She started the second half with Sullivan, Joiner and Foreman, along with 6-3 post Kelli Harned and 5-8 guard Sheryl Clark.  
However, the Owls took advantage of several Texas A&M turnovers (24 for the game) to erase a 39-34 Aggie lead. Harned, Joiner and Foreman scored the Aggie Ladies' first seven points of the second half, and it appeared that Texas A&M would build a sizeable lead.  
However, baskets by forward Pat Krieger, guard Kathy Barnard and a layup by forward Goya Qualls gave the Owls a 40-39 lead with 12:30 left in the game. After Texas A&M freshman post Mitchell Tatum put the Aggies ahead 41-40 at the 11:32 mark, Rice took the lead for good on a jumper by guard Lorraine Schunck.  
Texas A&M managed only 15 points in the second half, while the Owls scored 27. For the game, the Aggie Ladies shot a miserable 38 percent from the floor, with Rice connecting on 45 percent. Texas A&M outrebounded the

Owls 35-32.  
Rapp said the Aggie Ladies, who are hitting 39 percent of their field goals for the year, just haven't shot well enough to win.  
"When you can't shoot, you have a hard time winning," Rapp said.  
The Aggie Ladies played good defense in spurts during the game, forcing several turnovers and two 30-second violations by the Owls. But it was the strong rebounding and scoring of the Owls' three-leading players which gave them the easy win.  
Harned was the Aggie Ladies' only double-figure scorer with 11, while for Rice, Goff and Qualls had 17 points apiece. Krieger followed with 16 points, and Goff had four steals. Other leading scorers for Texas A&M were Sullivan with eight points, Foreman with seven and Joiner with six.  
Texas A&M freshman post Janet Duckham came off the bench for a game-high eight rebounds.  
Rice Head Coach Linda Tucker said her team's aggressive defense paved the way for the win.  
"I think we were creating the turnovers and capitalizing on them — that was a major factor down the stretch. We put a lot of pressure on them with our defense, and moved the ball real well on offense. We executed well on our passing game, and that was a key."

# Houston clips San Diego; Malone, Hayes dominate

**HOUSTON** — The Houston Rockets made it to the NBA championship series last year with a losing record, but the players know it will take better than that to get in the playoffs this season.  
If Houston is to turn its 16-19 season around and make a run at the playoffs, the time has come to do it. The Rockets opened an extended home stand Tuesday night by defeating the San Diego Clippers 107-106. Houston now plays 10 of its next 11 games at home.  
"We need to win as many games at home as we can," said guard Allan Leavell, who hit two three-point shots in the Clipper game. "This is our opportunity to make up ground and make the playoffs."  
The Rockets got 33 points from center Moses Malone and 17 points and 15 rebounds from forward Elvin Hayes. The play of Malone and Hayes will be the key to a successful homestand for Houston.  
Clipper coach Paul Silas said: "The Rockets are a good team and Elvin Hayes is fitting in much better than when we saw them the first time. And believe me, with two big guys like Hayes and Malone underneath, it is tough."  
The Rockets needed a free throw from Robert Reid with two seconds left to beat the 9-25 Clippers.  
Rockets coach Del Harris was not enthusiastic about the win.  
"Our shooting in the third quarter hurt us but we hung in there to play well enough to win," he said.  
"The Clippers are tough to defend because everyone on the floor can score. We made some mistakes tonight both offensively and defensively. But despite a great effort by the Clippers we won the game."  
Joe Bryant led San Diego with 19 points, while Tom Chambers followed with 15 points.
