"The AD position is the only one that is open — that's what we're looking for," he reiterated Saturday afternoon from his home in Dallas.

However, Schembechler said in his announcement Friday that he was under the impression that the Texas A&M offer included both the coaching job

and the athletic directorship.

Among the names being mentioned for the job(s) are University of Pittsburgh Head Coach Jackie Sherrill, Florida State University AD C.W. "Hootie" Ingram and Dallas Cowboy quarterback coach John Mack-

Ingram, who has finished his first year at FSU after having been associate commissioner of Southeastern Conference, said Saturday from his home in Talahassee, Fla.: "I'm not in a position to make a statement on (the post), because I've got a job here right now. There is really nothing I can add to it at this

The chain of events which has transpired during the past few began Thursday afternoon, when reports of a Texas A&M offer to Schembechler started circulating. Speculation

varied, as did theories about where such an offer could have been made, and by whom.

While rumors and reports were being investigated, officials at Texas A&M either voiced surprise or refused to comment on the situation. University President Frank E. Vandiver issued the following statement Thurs-

We have considered several individuals. We are not at a point where we can discuss particular persons. So we can neither confirm or deny any name

that might be posed to me."

Interim Athletic Director
Wally Groff, who took over when former AD Marvin Tate's resignation took effect Oct. 31, said he knew nothing about negotiations between Texas A&M and Schembechler. He added that, to his knowledge, no events taking place at the NCAA convention warranted these re-

about the origin of the reports ning and chairman of the University Athletic Council, said Thursday night that he could not comment on the possibility of a deal with Schembechler. Samson accompanied Groff to

the NCAA convention. "Two or three people put their names in the hat (for the AD post) ... and we chatted with some of the people, but there was nothing that came out of the convention," Samson said. "I can't comment further, because haven't been involved that closely in the (selection) pro-

Friday afternoon, Vandiver released another statement reaffirming the position he had taken Thursday — that he was 'not in a position to comment on the progress of this endeavor.

Wilson, who met with Vandiver Friday, said later that, regardless of either Schembechler's decision or which post(s) the Michigan coach would assume if he accepted the offer, Texas A&M probably wouldn't honor the final year on his own contract.

He added that he would not quit his coaching job, and that "it's to the point where they've got to give me a new contract or else fire me." Resignation would and "our" rejection.

Bright said Saturday that he saw Schembechler's decision as a two-part story — "his" rejection


